#### 1

<sup>1</sup> BLESSED is the man who has not walked in the counsel of the ungodly, and has not stood in the way of sinners, and has not sat in the seat of \*evil men.

<sup>2</sup> But his †pleasure is in the law of the Lord; and in his law will he meditate day and night.

- <sup>3</sup> And he shall be as a tree planted by the brooks of waters, which shall yield its fruit in its season, and its leaf shall not fall off; and whatsoever he shall do shall be prospered.
- <sup>4</sup> Not so the ungodly;—not so: but rather as the ‡chaff which the wind scatters away from the face of the earth.

5 Therefore the ungodly shall not rise in judg-

ment, nor sinners in the counsel of the just.

<sup>6</sup> For the Lord knows the way of the righteous; but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

- ¹ ♥ Wherefore did the heathen rage, and the nations imagine vain things?
- <sup>2</sup> The kings of the earth stood up, and the rulers gathered themselves together, against the Lord, and against his Christ;
- <sup>3</sup> saying, Let us break through their bonds, and cast away their yoke from us.

- <sup>4</sup> He that dwells in the heavens shall laugh them to scorn, and the Lord shall mock them.
- <sup>5</sup> Then shall he speak to them in his anger, and trouble them in his fury.
- <sup>6</sup> But I have been made king by him on Sion his holy mountain,
- <sup>7</sup> declaring the ordinance of the Lord: the Lord said to me, <sup>⋄</sup> Thou art my Son, to-day have I begotten thee.
- <sup>8</sup> Ask of me, and I will give thee the heathen *for* thine inheritance, and the ends of the earth *for* thy possession.
- <sup>9</sup> Thou shalt \*rule them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces as a potter's vessel.
- <sup>10</sup> Now therefore understand, ye kings: be instructed, all ye that judge the earth.
- <sup>11</sup> Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice in him with trembling.
- 12 †Accept correction, lest at any time the Lord be angry, and ye should perish from the righteous way: whensoever his wrath shall be suddenly kindled, blessed are all they that trust in him.

- <sup>2</sup> O Lord, why are they that afflict me multiplied? many rise up against me.

- <sup>3</sup> Many say concerning my soul, There is no deliverance for him in his God. \*Pause.
- <sup>4</sup> But thou, O Lord, art my helper: my glory, and the one that lifts up my head.
- <sup>5</sup> I cried to the Lord with my voice, and he heard me out of his holy mountain. Pause.
- <sup>6</sup> I lay down and slept; I awaked; for the Lord will help me.

<sup>7</sup> I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people, who beset me round about.

- <sup>8</sup> Arise, Lord; deliver me, my God: for thou hast smitten all who were without cause mine enemies; thou hast broken the teeth of sinners.
- <sup>9</sup> Deliverance is the Lord's, and thy blessing is upon thy people.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, a Song of David among *the* Psalms.
- <sup>2</sup> When I called upon *him*, the God of my righteousness heard me: thou hast made room for me in tribulation; pity me, and hearken to my prayer.
- <sup>3</sup> O ye sons of men, how long *will ye be* \*slow of heart? wherefore do ye love vanity, and seek falsehood? Pause.
- <sup>4</sup> But know ye that the Lord has done wondrous things for his holy one: the Lord will hear me when I cry to him.

<sup>6</sup> Offer the sacrifice of righteousness, and trust

in the Lord.

<sup>7</sup> Many say, Who will shew us good things? the light of thy countenance, O Lord, has been manifested towards us.

<sup>8</sup> Thou hast put gladness into my heart: they have been satisfied with the fruit of their corn

and wine and oil.

<sup>9</sup> I will †both lie down in peace and sleep: for thou, Lord, only hast caused me to dwell securely.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, a Psalm of David, concerning her that inherits.
- <sup>2</sup> Hearken to my words, O Lord, \*attend to my cry.

<sup>3</sup> Attend to the voice of my supplication, my King, and my God: for to thee, O Lord, will I pray.

- <sup>4</sup> In the morning thou shalt hear my voice: in the morning will I wait upon thee, and will look up.
- <sup>5</sup> For thou art not a God that desires iniquity; neither shall the worker of wickedness dwell with thee.
- <sup>6</sup> Neither shall the transgressors continue in thy sight: thou hatest, O Lord, all them that work iniquity.

- <sup>7</sup> Thou wilt destroy all that speak falsehood: the Lord abhors the bloody and deceitful man.
- <sup>8</sup> But I will enter into thine house in the multitude of thy mercy: I will worship in thy fear toward thy holy temple.
- <sup>9</sup> Lead me, O Lord, in thy righteousness because of mine enemies; make my way plain before thy face.
- <sup>10</sup> For there is no truth in their mouth; their heart is vain; their <sup>♠</sup> throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit.
- <sup>11</sup> Judge them, O God; let them †fail of their counsels: cast them out according to the abundance of their ungodliness; for they have provoked thee, O Lord.
- <sup>12</sup> But let all that trust on thee be glad in thee: they shall exult for ever, and thou shalt dwell among them; and all that love thy name shall rejoice in thee.
- 13 For thou, Lord, shalt bless the righteous: thou hast ‡compassed us as with a shield of favour.

- <sup>2</sup> O Lord, rebuke me not in thy wrath, neither chasten me in thine anger.
- <sup>3</sup> Pity me, O Lord; for I am weak: heal me, O Lord; for my bones are vexed.

- <sup>4</sup> My soul also is grievously vexed: but thou, O Lord, how long?
- <sup>5</sup> Return, O Lord, deliver my soul: save me for thy mercy's sake.
- <sup>6</sup> For in death no man remembers thee: and who will give thee thanks in Hades?
- <sup>7</sup>\*I am wearied with my groaning; I shall wash my bed every night; I shall water my couch with my tears.
- <sup>8</sup> Mine eye is troubled because of my wrath; I am worn out because of all my enemies.
- <sup>9</sup> Depart from me, all ye that work iniquity; for the Lord has heard the voice of my weeping.
- <sup>10</sup> The Lord has hearkened to my petition; the Lord has accepted my prayer.
- <sup>11</sup> Let all mine enemies be put to shame and sore troubled: let them be turned back and grievously put to shame speedily.

- <sup>2</sup> O Lord my God, in thee have I trusted: save me from all them that persecute me, and deliver me.

- <sup>4</sup> O Lord my God, if I have done this; (if there is unrighteousness in my hands;)
- <sup>5</sup> if I have requited with evil those who requited me *with good*; may I then perish empty by means of my enemies.

- <sup>6</sup> Let the enemy persecute my soul, and take it; and let him trample my life on the ground, and lay my glory in the dust. Pause.
- <sup>7</sup> Arise, O Lord, in thy wrath; be exalted †in the utmost boundaries of mine enemies: awake, O Lord my God, according to the decree which thou didst command.
- <sup>8</sup> And the congregation of the nations shall compass thee: and for this cause do thou return on high.
- <sup>9</sup> The Lord shall judge the nations: judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness, and according to my innocence that is in me.
- <sup>10</sup> Oh let the wickedness of sinners come to an end; and *then* thou shalt direct the righteous, O God that searchest the hearts and reins.
- <sup>11</sup> My help is righteous, *coming* from God who saves the upright in heart.
- <sup>12</sup> God is a righteous judge, and strong, and patient, not inflicting vengeance every day.
- <sup>13</sup> If ye will not repent, he will furbish his sword; he has bent his bow, and made it ready.
- 14 And on it he has fitted the instruments of death; he has completed his arrows for the ‡raging ones.
- <sup>15</sup> Behold, he has travailed with unrighteousness, he has conceived trouble, and brought forth iniquity.
- <sup>16</sup> He has opened a pit, and dug it up, and he shall fall into the ditch which he has made.

- <sup>4</sup> For I will regard the heavens, the work of thy fingers; the moon and stars, which thou hast established.

- <sup>6</sup> Thou madest him a little less than angels, thou hast crowned him with glory and honour;
- <sup>7</sup> and thou hast set him over the works of thy hands: thou hast put all things under his feet:
- <sup>8</sup> sheep and all \*oxen, yea, and the cattle of the field;
- <sup>9</sup> the birds of the sky, and the fish of the sea, the *creatures* passing through the paths of the sea.
- <sup>10</sup> O Lord our Lord, how wonderful is thy name in all the earth!

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, a Psalm of David, concerning the secrets of the Son.
- <sup>2</sup> I will give thanks to thee, O Lord, with my whole heart; I will recount all thy wonderful works.

<sup>3</sup> I will be glad and exult in thee: I will sing to thy name, O thou Most High.

<sup>4</sup> When mine enemies are turned back, they shall be feeble and perish at thy presence.

- <sup>5</sup> For thou hast maintained my cause and my right; thou satest on the throne, that judgest righteousness.
- <sup>6</sup> Thou hast rebuked the nations, and the ungodly one has perished; thou hast blotted out their name for ever, even for ever and ever.
- <sup>7</sup> The swords of the enemy have failed utterly; and thou hast destroyed cities: their memorial has been destroyed with a noise,
- <sup>8</sup> but the Lord endures for ever: he has prepared his throne for judgment.
- <sup>9</sup> And he will judge the world in righteousness, he will judge the nations in uprightness.
- <sup>10</sup> The Lord also is become a refuge for the poor, a seasonable help, in affliction.
- <sup>11</sup> And let them that know thy name hope in thee: for thou, O Lord, hast not failed them that diligently seek thee.
- <sup>12</sup> Sing praises to the Lord, who dwells in Sion: declare his dealings among the nations.
- <sup>13</sup> For he remembered them, *in* making inquisition for blood: he has not forgotten the supplication of the poor.

- <sup>14</sup> Have mercy upon me, O Lord; look upon my affliction *which I suffer* of mine enemies, thou that liftest me up from the gates of death:
- <sup>15</sup> that I may declare all thy praises in the gates of the daughter of Sion: I will exult in thy salvation.
- <sup>16</sup> The heathen are caught in the destruction which they planned: in the very snare which they hid is their foot taken.
- <sup>17</sup> The Lord is known as executing judgments: the sinner is taken in the works of his hands. A song of Pause.
- <sup>18</sup> Let sinners be driven away into Hades, *even* all the nations that forget God.
- <sup>19</sup> For the poor shall not be forgotten for ever: the patience of the needy ones shall not perish for ever.
- <sup>20</sup> Arise, O Lord, let not man prevail: let the heathen be judged before thee.
- <sup>21</sup> Appoint, O Lord, a lawgiver over them: let the heathen know that they are men. Pause.
- <sup>22</sup>\*Why standest thou afar off, O Lord? *why* dost thou overlook *us* in times of need, in affliction?
- <sup>23</sup> While the ungodly one acts proudly, the poor is †hotly pursued: *the wicked* are taken in the crafty counsels which they imagine.

<sup>24</sup> Because the sinner praises himself for the desires of his heart; and the unjust one blesses himself.

<sup>25</sup> The sinner has provoked the Lord: according to the abundance of his ‡pride he will not

seek after him: God is not before him.

<sup>26</sup> His ways are <sup>§</sup>profane at all times; thy judgments are removed from before him: he will gain the mastery over all his enemies.

<sup>27</sup> For he has said in his heart, I shall not be moved, *continuing* without evil from generation

to generation. 🌣

- <sup>28</sup> Whose mouth is full of cursing, and bitterness, and fraud: under his tongue are trouble and pain.
- <sup>29</sup> He lies in wait with rich *men* in secret places, in order to slay the innocent: his eyes are \*\*set against the poor.
- <sup>30</sup> He lies in wait in secret as a lion in his den: he lies in wait to ravish the poor, to ravish the poor when he draws him *after him*: he will bring him down in his snare.

31 He will bow down and fall when he has

mastered the poor.

<sup>32</sup> For he has said in his heart, God has forgotten: he has turned away his face so as never to look.

<sup>33</sup> Arise, O Lord God; let thy hand be lifted up:

forget not the poor.

<sup>34</sup> Wherefore has the wicked provoked God? for he has said in his heart, He will not require

  35 Thou seest it; for thou dost observe trouble and wrath, to deliver them into thy hands: the poor has been left to thee; thou wast a helper to the orphan.
- <sup>36</sup> Break thou the arm of the sinner and wicked man: his sin shall be sought for, and shall not be found.
- <sup>37</sup> The Lord shall reign for ever, even for ever and ever: ye Gentiles shall perish out of his land.
- 38 The Lord has heard the desire of the poor: thine ear has inclined to the preparation of their heart:
- <sup>39</sup> to plead for the orphan and afflicted, that man may no more boast upon the earth.

In the Lord I have put my trust: how will ye say to my soul, Flee to the mountains as a sparrow?

- <sup>2</sup> For behold the sinners have bent *their* bow, they have prepared their arrows for the quiver, to shoot \*privily at the upright in heart.
- <sup>3</sup> For they have pulled down what thou didst frame, but what has the righteous done?
- <sup>4</sup> The Lord is in his holy temple, as for the Lord, his throne is in heaven: his eyes look upon the poor, his eyelids try the sons of men.
- <sup>5</sup> The Lord tries the righteous and the ungodly: and he that loves unrighteousness hates his own soul.

- <sup>5</sup> who have said, We will magnify our tongue; our lips are our own: who is Lord of us?
- <sup>6</sup> Because of the misery of the poor, and because of the sighing of the needy, now will I arise, saith the Lord, I will set *them* in safety; I will speak *to them* thereof openly.
- <sup>7</sup> The oracles of the Lord are pure oracles; as silver tried in the fire, proved in †a furnace of earth, purified seven times.
- <sup>8</sup> Thou, O Lord, shalt keep us, and shalt preserve us, from this generation, and for ever.
- <sup>9</sup> The ungodly walk around: according to thy greatness thou hast greatly exalted the sons of men.

- <sup>6</sup> But I have hoped in thy mercy; my heart shall exult in thy salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has dealt bountifully with me, and I will sing psalms to the name of the Lord most high.

<sup>1</sup> For the end, a Psalm of David.

The fool has said in his heart, There is no God. They have corrupted *themselves*, and become abominable in their devices; there is none that does goodness, there is not even so much as one.

- <sup>2</sup> The Lord looked down from heaven upon the sons of men, to see if there were any that understood, or sought after God.
- <sup>3</sup> They are all gone out of the way, they are together become good for nothing, there is none that does good, no not one. Their throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps is under their lips: whose mouth is full of cursing and bitterness;

their feet are swift to shed blood: destruction and misery are in their ways; and the way of peace they have not known: there is no fear of God before their eyes.

- <sup>4</sup> Will not all the workers of iniquity know, who eat up my people as they would eat bread? they have not called upon the Lord.
- <sup>5</sup> There were they alarmed with fear, where there was no fear; for God is in the righteous generation.
- <sup>6</sup> Ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the Lord is his hope.
- <sup>7</sup> Who will bring the salvation of Israel out of Sion? when the Lord brings back the captivity of his people, let Jacob exult, and Israel be glad.

## 14

<sup>1</sup> A Psalm of David.

- O Lord, who shall sojourn in thy tabernacle? and who shall dwell in thy holy mountain?
- <sup>2</sup> He that walks blameless, and works righteousness, who speaks truth in his heart.
- <sup>3</sup> Who has not spoken craftily with his tongue, neither has done evil to his neighbour, nor taken up a reproach against them that dwelt nearest to him.
- <sup>4</sup> In his sight an evil-worker is set at nought, but he honours them that fear the Lord. He swears to his neighbour, and disappoints *him* not.
- <sup>5</sup> He has not \*lent his money on usury, and has not received bribes against the innocent. He that does these things shall never be moved.

Keep me, O Lord; for I have hoped in thee.

- <sup>2</sup> I said to the Lord, Thou art my Lord; for thou hast no need of my \*goodness.
- <sup>3</sup> On behalf of the saints that are in his land, he has magnified all his pleasure in them.
- <sup>4</sup> Their weaknesses have been multiplied; afterward they hasted. I will by no means assemble their bloody meetings, neither will I make mention of their names with my lips.
- <sup>5</sup> The Lord is the portion of mine inheritance and of my cup: thou art he that restores my inheritance to me.

<sup>6</sup> The lines have fallen to me in the best places,

yea, I have a most excellent heritage.

<sup>7</sup> I will bless the Lord who has instructed me; my reins too have chastened me even †till night.

<sup>8</sup> I foresaw the Lord always before my face; for he is on my right hand, that I should not be moved.

<sup>9</sup> Therefore my heart rejoiced and my tongue exulted; moreover also my flesh shall rest in

hope:

- <sup>10</sup> because thou wilt not leave my soul in hell, neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption.
- <sup>11</sup> Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou wilt fill me with joy with thy countenance: at thy right hand *there are* delights for ever.

Hearken, O Lord \*of my righteousness, attend to my petition; give ear to my prayer not *uttered* with deceitful lips.

- <sup>2</sup> Let my judgment come forth from thy presence; let mine eyes behold righteousness.
- <sup>3</sup> Thou hast proved mine heart; thou hast visited *me* by night; thou hast tried me as with fire, and unrighteousness has not been found in me: *I am purposed* that my mouth shall not speak *amiss*.
- <sup>4</sup> As for the works of men, by the words of thy lips I have †guarded *myself from* hard ways.
- <sup>5</sup> Direct my steps in thy paths, that my steps slip not.
- <sup>6</sup> I have cried, for thou heardest me, O God: incline thine ear to me, and hearken to my words.
- <sup>7</sup> Shew the marvels of thy mercies, thou that savest them that hope in thee.
- <sup>8</sup> Keep me as the apple of the eye from those that resist thy right hand: thou shalt screen me by the covering of thy wings,
- <sup>9</sup> from the face of the ungodly that have afflicted me: mine enemies have compassed about my soul.
- <sup>10</sup> They have enclosed *themselves with* their own fat: their mouth has spoken pride.

- <sup>11</sup> They have now cast me out and compassed me round about: they have set their eyes *so as* to bow them down to the ground.
- <sup>12</sup> They laid wait for me as a lion ready for prey, and like a lion's whelp dwelling in secret *places*.
- <sup>13</sup> Arise, O Lord, prevent them, and cast them down: deliver my soul from the ungodly: *draw* thy sword,
- <sup>14</sup> because of the enemies of thine hand: O Lord, destroy them from the earth; scatter them in their life, though their belly has been filled with thy hidden *treasures*: they have been satisfied with ‡uncleanness, and have left the remnant *of their possessions* to their babes.
- <sup>15</sup> But I shall appear in righteousness before thy face: I shall be satisfied when thy glory appears.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, *a Psalm* of David the servant of the Lord; *the words* which he spoke to the Lord, *even* the words of this Song, in the day in which the Lord delivered him out of the hand of all his enemies, and out of the hand of Saul: and he said:
  - <sup>2</sup> I will love thee, O Lord, my strength.
- <sup>3</sup> The Lord is my firm support, and my refuge, and my deliverer; my God is my helper, I will hope in him; *he is* my defender, and the horn of my salvation, and my helper.
- <sup>4</sup> I will call upon the Lord with praises, and I shall be saved from mine enemies.

- <sup>5</sup> The pangs of death compassed me, and the torrents of ungodliness troubled me exceedingly.
- <sup>6</sup> The pangs of hell came round about me: the snares of death prevented me.
- <sup>7</sup> And when I was afflicted I called upon the Lord, and cried to my God: he heard my voice out of his holy temple, and my cry shall enter before him, *even* into his ears.

- <sup>12</sup> And he made darkness his secret place: round about him was his tabernacle, *even* dark water in the clouds of the air.
- <sup>13</sup> At the brightness before him the clouds passed, hail and coals of fire.
- <sup>14</sup> The Lord also thundered from heaven, and the Highest uttered his voice.
- <sup>15</sup> And he sent forth *his* weapons, and scattered them; and multiplied lightnings, and routed them.
- <sup>16</sup> And the springs of waters appeared, and the foundations of the world were exposed, at thy rebuke, O Lord, at the blasting of the breath of thy wrath.

- <sup>17</sup> He sent from on high and took me, he drew me to himself out of many waters.
- <sup>18</sup> He will deliver me from my mighty enemies, and from them that hate me; for they are stronger than I.
- <sup>19</sup> They prevented me in the day of mine affliction: but the Lord was my stay against *them*.
- <sup>20</sup> And he brought me out into a wide place: he will deliver me, because he has pleasure in me.
- <sup>21</sup> And the Lord will recompense me according to my righteousness; even according to the purity of my hands will he recompense me.
- <sup>22</sup> For I have kept the ways of the Lord and have not wickedly departed from my God.
- <sup>23</sup> For all his judgments were before me, and his ordinances departed not from me.
- <sup>24</sup> And I shall be blameless with him, and shall keep myself from mine iniquity.
- <sup>25</sup> And the Lord shall recompense me according to my righteousness, and according to the purity of my hands before his eyes.
- <sup>26</sup> With the holy thou wilt be holy; and with the innocent man thou wilt be innocent.
- <sup>27</sup> And with the excellent *man* thou wilt be excellent; and with the perverse thou wilt shew frowardness.
- <sup>28</sup> For thou wilt save the lowly people, and wilt humble the eyes of the proud.
- <sup>29</sup> For thou, O Lord, wilt light my lamp: my God, thou wilt lighten my darkness.
- <sup>30</sup> For by thee shall I be delivered from a troop; and by my God I will pass over a wall.

- <sup>31</sup> As for my God, his way is perfect: the oracles of the Lord are tried in the fire; he is a protector of all them that hope in him.
- 32 For who is God but the Lord? and who is a God except our God?
- <sup>33</sup> It is God that girds me with strength, and has made my way blameless:
- <sup>34</sup> who strengthens my feet as hart's feet, and sets me upon high places.
- <sup>35</sup> He instructs my hands for war; and thou hast made my arms *as* a brazen bow.
- <sup>36</sup> And thou hast made me \*secure in my salvation: and thy right hand has helped me, and thy correction has upheld me to the end; yea, thy correction itself shall instruct me.

37 Thou hast made room for my goings under

me, and my footsteps did not fail.

- <sup>47</sup> The Lord lives; and blessed *be* my God; and let the God of my salvation be exalted.
  - <sup>48</sup> It is God that avenges me, and has subdued

the nations under me;

<sup>49</sup> my deliverer from angry enemies: thou shalt set me on high ‡above them that rise up against me: thou shalt deliver me from the unrighteous man.

50 Therefore will I confess to thee, O Lord,

among the Gentiles, and sing to thy name.

<sup>51</sup> *God* magnifies the deliverances of his king; and deals mercifully with David his anointed, and his seed, for ever.

- <sup>7</sup> Thou hast hated them that idly persist in vanities: but I have hoped in the Lord.
- <sup>8</sup> I will exult and be glad in thy mercy: for thou hast looked upon mine affliction; thou hast saved my soul from distresses.
- <sup>9</sup> And thou hast not shut me up into the hands of the enemy: thou hast set my feet in a wide place.
- <sup>10</sup> Pity me, O Lord, for I am afflicted: my eye is troubled with indignation, my soul and my belly.
- <sup>11</sup> For my life is spent with grief, and my years with groanings: my strength has been weakened through poverty, and my bones are troubled.
- <sup>12</sup> I became a reproach among all mine enemies, but exceedingly so to my neighbours, and a fear to mine acquaintance: they that saw me without fled from me.

- <sup>13</sup> I have been forgotten as a dead man out of mind: I am become as a broken vessel.
- <sup>14</sup> For I heard the slander of many that dwelt round about: when they were gathered together against me, they took counsel to take my life.
- <sup>15</sup> But I hoped in thee, O Lord: I said, Thou art my God.
- <sup>16</sup> My lots are in thy hands: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies,
- <sup>17</sup> and from them that persecute me. Make thy face to shine upon thy servant: save me in thy mercy.
- <sup>18</sup> O Lord, let me not be ashamed, for I have called upon thee: let the ungodly be ashamed, and brought down to Hades.
- <sup>19</sup> Let the deceitful lips become dumb, which speak iniquity against the righteous with pride and scorn.
- <sup>20</sup> How abundant is the multitude of thy goodness, O Lord, which thou hast laid up for them that fear thee! thou hast wrought *it* out for them that hope on thee, in the presence of the sons of men.
- <sup>21</sup> Thou wilt hide them in the secret of thy presence from the vexation of man: thou wilt screen them in a tabernacle from the contradiction of tongues.
- <sup>22</sup> Blessed be the Lord: for he has magnified his mercy in a fortified city.
- <sup>23</sup> But I said in my extreme fear, I am cast out from the sight of thine eyes: therefore thou didst hearken, O Lord, to the voice of my supplication when I cried to thee.

- <sup>24</sup> Love the Lord, all ye his saints: for the Lord seeks for truth, and renders *a reward* to them that deal very proudly.
- <sup>25</sup> Be of good courage, and let your heart be strengthened, all ye that hope in the Lord.

- \* Blessed *are they* whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sins are covered.

- <sup>4</sup> For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me: I became thoroughly miserable while a †thorn was fastened in *me*. Pause.

<sup>11</sup> Be glad in the Lord, and exult, ye righteous: and glory, all ye that are upright in heart.

Rejoice in the Lord, ye righteous; praise becomes the upright.

<sup>6</sup> By the word of the Lord the heavens were established; and all the host of them by the breath of his *mouth*.

bottle; who lays up the deeps in treasuries.

<sup>8</sup> Let all the earth fear the Lord; and let all that dwell in the world be moved because of him.

<sup>9</sup> For he spoke, and they were made; he commanded, and they were created.

- <sup>11</sup> But the counsel of the Lord endures for ever, the thoughts of his heart from generation to generation.
- <sup>12</sup> Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord; the people whom he has chosen for his own inheritance.

13 The Lord looks out of heaven; he beholds all

the sons of men.

- <sup>14</sup> He looks from his prepared habitation on all the dwellers on the earth;
- <sup>15</sup> who fashioned their hearts ‡alone; who understands all their works.
- <sup>16</sup> A king is not saved by reason of a great host; and a giant shall not be delivered by the greatness of his strength.
- <sup>17</sup> A horse is vain for safety; neither shall he be delivered by the greatness of his power.
- <sup>18</sup> Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on them that fear him, those that hope in his mercy;
- <sup>19</sup> to deliver their souls from death, and to keep them alive in famine.
- <sup>20</sup> Our soul waits on the Lord; for he is our helper and defender.
- <sup>21</sup> For our heart shall rejoice in him, and we have hoped in his holy name.
- <sup>22</sup> Let thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us, according as we have hoped in thee.

- <sup>7</sup> This poor man cried, and the Lord hearkened to him, and delivered him out of all his afflictions.

16 The eyes of the Lord are over the righteous,

and his ears are open to their prayer:

- <sup>17</sup> but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil, to destroy their memorial from the earth. The righteous cried, and the Lord hearkened to them,
  - 18 and delivered them out of all their afflic-
- 19 The Lord is near to \$\display\$ them that are of a contrite heart; and will save the lowly in spirit.
- <sup>20</sup> Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but out of them all the Lord will deliver them.

<sup>21</sup> He keeps all their bones: not one of them

shall be broken.

<sup>22</sup> The death of sinners is evil: and they that

hate righteousness will go wrong.

- <sup>4</sup> Let them that seek my soul be ashamed and confounded: let them that devise evils against me be turned back and put to shame.
- <sup>5</sup> Let them be as dust before the wind, and an angel of the Lord afflicting them.

<sup>6</sup> Let their way be dark and slippery, and an

angel of the Lord persecuting them.

<sup>7</sup> For without cause they have hid for me their destructive snare: without a cause they have reproached my soul.

<sup>8</sup> Let a snare which they know not come upon them: and the gin which they hid take them; and

let them fall into the very same snare.

<sup>9</sup> But my soul shall exult in the Lord: it shall delight in his salvation.

- <sup>10</sup> All my bones shall say, O Lord, who is like to thee? delivering the poor out of the hand of them that are stronger than he, yea, the poor and needy one from them that spoil him.
- <sup>11</sup> Unjust witnesses arose, and asked me of things I knew not.
- <sup>12</sup> They rewarded me evil for good, and bereavement to my soul.
- <sup>13</sup> But I, when they troubled me, put on sackcloth, and humbled my soul with fasting: and my prayer shall return to my *own* bosom.
- <sup>14</sup> I behaved agreeably towards them as *if it had been* our neighbour *or* brother: I humbled myself as one mourning and sad of countenance.
- <sup>15</sup> Yet they rejoiced against me, and plagues were \*plentifully brought against me, and I knew

it not: they were scattered, but †repented not.

- <sup>16</sup> They tempted me, they sneered at me most contemptuously, they gnashed their teeth upon me.
- <sup>17</sup> O Lord, when wilt thou look upon me? Deliver my soul from their mischief, mine onlybegotten one from the lions.
- <sup>18</sup> I will give thanks to thee even in a great congregation: in an abundant people I will praise thee.
- <sup>19</sup> Let not them that are mine enemies without a cause rejoice against me; who hate me for nothing, and wink with their eyes.
- <sup>20</sup> For to me they spoke peaceably, but imagined deceits in *their* anger.
- <sup>21</sup> And they opened wide their mouth upon me; they said, Aha, aha, our eyes have seen *it*.
- <sup>22</sup> Thou hast seen *it*, O Lord: keep not silence: O Lord, withdraw not *thyself* from me.
- <sup>23</sup> Awake, O Lord, and attend to my judgment, *even* to my cause, my God and my Lord.
- <sup>24</sup> Judge me, O Lord, according to thy righteousness, O Lord my God; and let them not rejoice against me.
- <sup>25</sup> Let them not say in their hearts, Aha, aha, *it* is pleasing to our soul: neither let them say, We have devoured him.
- <sup>26</sup> Let them be confounded and ashamed together that rejoice at my afflictions: let them be clothed with shame and confusion that speak great swelling words against me.

<sup>27</sup> Let them that rejoice in my righteousness exult and be glad: and let them say continually, The Lord be magnified, who desire the peace of his servant.

- <sup>2</sup> The transgressor, that he may sin, says within himself, *that* ⋄ there is no fear of God before his eyes.
- <sup>3</sup> For he has dealt craftily before him, \*to discover his iniquity and hate it.
- <sup>4</sup>The words of his mouth are transgression and deceit: he is not inclined to understand *how* to do good.
- <sup>5</sup> He devises iniquity on his bed; he gives himself to every evil way; and does not abhor evil.

<sup>6</sup> O Lord, thy mercy is in the heaven; and thy

truth reaches to the clouds.

- <sup>7</sup> Thy righteousness is as the †mountains of God, thy judgments are as a great deep: O Lord, thou wilt preserve men and beasts.
- <sup>8</sup> How hast thou multiplied thy mercy, O God! so the children of men shall trust in the shelter of thy wings.
- <sup>9</sup> They shall be ‡fully satisfied with the fatness of thine house; and thou shalt cause them to drink of the full stream of thy delights.

- <sup>10</sup> For with thee is the fountain of life: in thy light we shall see light.
- <sup>11</sup> Extend thy mercy to them that know thee; and thy righteousness to the upright in heart.
- <sup>12</sup> Let not the foot of pride come against me, and let not the hand of sinners move me.
- <sup>13</sup> There have all the workers of iniquity fallen: they are cast out, and shall not be able to stand.

#### <sup>1</sup> A Psalm of David.

Fret not thyself because of evil-doers, neither be envious of them that do iniquity.

- <sup>2</sup> For they shall soon be withered as the grass, and shall soon fall away as the green herbs.
- <sup>3</sup> Hope in the Lord, and do good; and dwell on the land, and thou shalt be fed with the wealth of it.
- <sup>4</sup> Delight *thyself* in the Lord; and he shall grant thee the requests of thine heart.
- <sup>5</sup> Disclose thy way to the Lord, and hope in him; and he shall bring *it* to pass.
- <sup>6</sup> And he shall bring forth thy righteousness as the light, and thy judgment as the noon-day.
- <sup>7</sup> Submit thyself to the Lord, and supplicate him: fret not thyself because of him that prospers in his way, at the man that does unlawful deeds.
- <sup>8</sup> Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not thyself so as to do evil.
- <sup>9</sup> For evil-doers shall be destroyed: but they that wait on the Lord, they shall inherit the land.

- <sup>10</sup> And yet a little while, and the sinner shall not be, and thou shalt seek for his place, and shalt not find *it*.
- <sup>11</sup> But the meek shall inherit the earth; and shall delight *themselves* in the abundance of peace.
- <sup>12</sup> The sinner will watch for the righteous, and gnash his teeth upon him.
- <sup>13</sup> But the Lord shall laugh at him: for he foresees that his day will come.
- <sup>14</sup> Sinners have drawn their swords, they have bent their bow, to cast down the poor and needy one, *and* to slay the upright in heart.
- <sup>15</sup> Let their sword enter into their *own* heart, and their bows be broken.
  - <sup>16</sup> A little is better to the righteous than

abundant wealth of sinners.

- <sup>17</sup> For the arms of sinners shall be broken; but the Lord supports the righteous.
- <sup>18</sup> The Lord knows the ways of the perfect; and their inheritance shall be for eyer.

<sup>19</sup> They shall not be ashamed in an evil time; and in days of famine they shall be satisfied.

- <sup>20</sup> For the sinners shall perish; and the enemies of the Lord at the moment of their being honoured and exalted have utterly vanished like smoke.
- <sup>21</sup> The sinner borrows, and will not pay again: but the righteous has compassion, and gives.
- <sup>22</sup> For they that bless him shall inherit the earth; and they that curse him shall be utterly destroyed.
- <sup>23</sup> The steps of a man are rightly ordered by the Lord: and he will take pleasure in his way.

- <sup>24</sup> When he falls, he shall not be ruined: for the Lord supports his hand.
- <sup>25</sup> I was *once* young, indeed I am now old; yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed seeking bread.
- <sup>26</sup> He is merciful, and lends continually; and his seed shall be \*blessed.

<sup>27</sup> Turn aside from evil, and do good; and dwell

for ever.

- <sup>28</sup> For the Lord loves judgment, and will not forsake his saints; they shall be preserved for ever: the blameless shall be †avenged, but the seed of the ungodly shall be utterly destroyed.
- <sup>29</sup> But the righteous shall inherit the earth, and dwell upon it for ever.
- <sup>30</sup> The mouth of the righteous will meditate wisdom, and his tongue will speak of judgment.
- 31 The law of his God is in his heart; and his steps shall not ‡slide.
- <sup>32</sup> The sinner watches the righteous, and seeks to slay him.
- <sup>33</sup> But the Lord will not leave him in his hands, nor by any means condemn him when he is judged.
- <sup>34</sup> Wait on the Lord, and keep his way, and he shall exalt thee to inherit the land: when the wicked are destroyed, thou shalt see *it*.
- <sup>35</sup> I saw the ungodly very highly exalting himself, and lifting himself up like the cedars of Libanus.

- <sup>39</sup> But the salvation of the righteous is of the Lord; and he is their defender in the time of affliction.
- <sup>40</sup> And the Lord shall help them, and deliver them: and he shall rescue them from sinners, and save them, because they have hoped in him.

- <sup>7</sup> I have been wretched and bowed down continually: I went with a mourning countenance all the day.

- <sup>8</sup> For my soul is filled with mockings; and there is no health in my flesh.
- <sup>9</sup> I have been afflicted and brought down exceedingly: I have roared for the groaning of my heart.
- <sup>10</sup> But all my desire is before thee; and my groaning is not hidden from thee.
- <sup>11</sup> My heart is troubled, my strength has failed me; and the light of mine eyes is not with me.
- <sup>12</sup> My friends and my neighbours drew near before me, and stood still; and my nearest of kin stood afar off.
- <sup>13</sup> While they pressed hard upon me that sought my soul: and they that sought my hurt spoke vanities, and devised deceits all the day.
- <sup>14</sup> But I, as a deaf man, heard not; and was as a dumb man not opening his mouth.
- <sup>15</sup> And I was as a man that hears not, and who has no reproofs in his mouth.
- <sup>16</sup> For I hoped in thee, O Lord: thou wilt hear, O Lord my God.
- <sup>17</sup> For I said, Lest mine enemies rejoice against me: for when my feet were moved, they spoke boastingly against me.
- <sup>18</sup> For I am ready for \*plagues, and my grief is continually before me.
- <sup>19</sup> For I will declare mine iniquity, and be distressed for my sin.
- <sup>20</sup> But mine enemies live, and are mightier than I: and they that hate me unjustly are multiplied.

- <sup>21</sup> They that reward evil for good slandered me; because I followed righteousness.
- <sup>22</sup> Forsake me not, O Lord my God: depart not from me.

- <sup>2</sup> I said, I will take heed to my ways, that I sin not with my tongue: I set a guard on my mouth, while the sinner stood in my presence.
- <sup>3</sup> I was dumb, and humbled myself, and kept silence from good *words*; and my grief was renewed.
- <sup>4</sup> My heart grew hot within me, and a fire would kindle in my meditation: I spoke with my tongue,
- <sup>5</sup> O Lord, make me to know mine end, and the number of my days, what it is; that I may know what I lack.
- <sup>6</sup> Behold, thou hast made my days \*old; and my existence *is* as nothing before thee: nay, every man living *is* altogether vanity. Pause.
- <sup>7</sup> Surely man walks in a †shadow; nay, he is disquieted in vain: he lays up treasures, and knows not for whom he shall gather them.
- <sup>8</sup> And now what *is* my expectation? *is it* not the Lord? and my ground *of hope* is with thee. Pause.
- <sup>9</sup> Deliver me from all my transgressions: thou hast made me a reproach to the foolish.

- <sup>13</sup> O Lord, hearken to my prayer and my supplication: attend to my tears: be not silent, for I am a sojourner in the land, and a stranger, as all my fathers *were*.
- <sup>14</sup> Spare me, that I may be refreshed, before I depart, and be no more.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, a Psalm of David.
- <sup>2</sup> I waited patiently for the Lord; and he attended to me, and hearkened to my supplication.
- <sup>3</sup> And he brought me up out of a pit of misery, and from miry clay: and he set my feet on a rock, and ordered my goings aright.
- <sup>4</sup> And he put a new song into my mouth, *even* a hymn to our God: many shall see *it*, and fear, and shall hope in the Lord.

  - <sup>14</sup> Be pleased, O Lord, to deliver me; O Lord,

draw nigh to help me.

<sup>15</sup> Let those that seek my soul, to destroy it, be ashamed and confounded together; let those that wish me evil be turned backward and put to shame.

- <sup>6</sup> And the heavens shall declare his righteousness: for God is judge. Pause.
- <sup>7</sup> Hear, my people, and I will speak to thee, O Israel: and I will testify to thee: I am God, thy God.
- <sup>8</sup> I will not reprove thee on account of thy sacrifices; for thy whole-burnt-offerings are before me continually.
- <sup>9</sup> I will take no bullocks out of thine house, nor he-goats out of thy flocks.
- <sup>10</sup> For all the wild beasts of the thicket are mine, the cattle on the mountains, and oxen.
- <sup>11</sup> I know all the birds of the sky; and the beauty of the field is mine.

- <sup>5</sup> In God I will praise my words; all the day have I hoped in God; I will not fear what flesh shall do to me.
- <sup>6</sup> All the day long they have abominated my words; all their devices *are* against me for evil.
- <sup>7</sup> They will dwell near and hide *themselves*; they will watch my steps, accordingly as I have waited patiently in my soul.

- <sup>5</sup> They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head: my enemies that persecute me unrighteously are strengthened: then I †restored that which I took not away.
- <sup>6</sup> O God, thou knowest my foolishness; and my transgressions are not hidden from thee.
- <sup>7</sup> Let not them that wait on thee, O Lord of hosts, be ashamed on my account: let not them that seek thee, be ashamed on my account, O God of Israel.
- <sup>8</sup> For I have suffered reproach for thy sake; shame has covered my face.
- <sup>9</sup> I became strange to my brethren, and a stranger to my mother's children.
- 10 \* For the zeal of thine house has eaten me up; and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.
- <sup>11</sup> And I bowed down my soul with fasting, and that was made my reproach.
- <sup>12</sup> And I put on sackcloth for my covering; and I became a proverb to them.
- <sup>13</sup> They that sit in the gate talked against me, and they that drank wine sang against me.
- <sup>14</sup> But I *will cry* to thee, O Lord, in my prayer; O God, it is a propitious time: in the multitude of

thy mercy hear me, in the truth of thy salvation.

- <sup>15</sup> Save me from the mire, that I stick not *in it*: let me be delivered from them that hate me, and from the deep waters.
- <sup>16</sup> Let not the waterflood drown me, nor let the deep swallow me up; neither let the well shut its mouth upon me.
- <sup>17</sup> Hear me, O Lord; for thy mercy is good: according to the multitude of thy compassions look upon me.
- <sup>18</sup> And turn not away thy face from thy ‡servant; for I am afflicted: hear me speedily.
- <sup>19</sup> Draw nigh to my soul and redeem it: deliver me because of mine enemies.
- <sup>20</sup> For thou knowest my reproach, and my shame, and my confusion; all that afflict me are before thee.
- <sup>21</sup> My soul has waited for reproach and misery; and I waited for one to grieve with me, but there was none; and for one to comfort me, but I found none.
- They gave *me* also gall for my food, and made me drink vinegar for my thirst.
- <sup>23</sup> Det their table before them be for a snare, and for a recompence, and for a stumbling-block.
- <sup>24</sup> Let their eyes be darkened that they should not see; and bow down their back continually.
- <sup>25</sup> Pour out thy wrath upon them, and let the fury of thine anger take hold on them.
- <sup>26</sup> \* Let their habitation be made desolate; and let there be no inhabitant in their tents:

- <sup>27</sup> because they persecuted him whom thou hast smitten; and they have added to the grief of my wounds.
- <sup>28</sup> Add iniquity to their iniquity; and let them not come into thy righteousness.
- <sup>29</sup> Let them be blotted out of the book of the living, and let them not be written with the righteous.
- <sup>30</sup> I am poor and sorrowful; but the salvation of thy countenance has helped me.
- <sup>31</sup> I will praise the name of my God with a song, I will magnify him with praise;
- <sup>32</sup> and *this* shall please God more than a young calf having horns and hoofs.
- <sup>33</sup> Let the poor see and rejoice; seek the Lord diligently, and ye shall live.
- <sup>34</sup> For the Lord hears the poor, and does not set at nought his fettered ones.
- <sup>35</sup> Let the heavens and the earth praise him, the sea, and all things moving in them.
- <sup>36</sup> For God will save Sion, and the cities of Judea shall be built; and *men* shall dwell there, and inherit it.

<sup>37</sup> And the seed of his servants shall possess it, and they that love his name shall dwell therein.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, by David for a remembrance, that the Lord may save me.
  - <sup>2</sup> Draw nigh, O God, to my help.
- <sup>3</sup> Let them be ashamed and confounded that seek my soul: let them be turned backward and put to shame, that wish me evil.

- <sup>4</sup> Let them that say to me, Aha, aha, be turned back and put to shame immediately.
- <sup>5</sup> Let all that seek thee exult and be glad in thee: and let those that love thy salvation say continually, Let God be magnified.
- <sup>6</sup> But I am poor and needy; O God, help me: thou art my helper and deliverer, O Lord, delay not.

- <sup>1</sup> By David, *a Psalm sung by* the sons of Jonadab, and the first that were taken captive.
- O Lord, I have hoped in thee: let me never be put to shame.
- <sup>2</sup> In thy righteousness deliver me and rescue me: incline thine ear to me, and save me.
- <sup>3</sup> Be to me a protecting God, and a strong hold to save me: for thou art my fortress and my refuge.
- <sup>4</sup> Deliver me, O my God, from the hand of the sinner, from the hand of the transgressor and unjust man.
- <sup>5</sup> For thou art my support, O Lord; O Lord, *thou art* my hope from my youth.
- <sup>6</sup> On thee have I been stayed from the womb: from the belly of my mother thou art my protector: of thee is my \*praise continually.
- <sup>7</sup> I am become as it were a wonder to many; but thou art *my* strong helper.
- <sup>8</sup> Let my mouth be filled with praise, that I may hymn thy glory, *and* thy majesty all the day.

- <sup>9</sup> Cast me not off at the time of old age; forsake me not when my strength fails.
- <sup>10</sup> For mine enemies have spoken against me; and they that lay wait for my soul have taken counsel together,
- <sup>11</sup> saying, God has forsaken him: persecute ye and take him; for there is none to deliver *him*.
- <sup>12</sup> O God, go not far from me, O my God, draw nigh to my help.
- <sup>13</sup> Let those that plot against my soul be ashamed and utterly fail: let those that seek my hurt be clothed with shame and dishonour.
- <sup>14</sup> But I will hope continually, and will praise thee more and more.
- <sup>15</sup> My mouth shall declare thy righteousness openly, *and* thy salvation all the day; for I am not acquainted with the affairs *of men*.
- <sup>16</sup> I will go on in the might of the Lord: O Lord, I will make mention of thy righteousness only.
- <sup>17</sup> O God, thou hast taught me from my youth, and until now will I declare thy wonders;
- <sup>18</sup> even until I am old and advanced in years. O God, forsake me not; until I shall have declared thine arm to all the generation that is to come:
- <sup>19</sup> even thy power and thy righteousness, O God, up to the highest *heavens*, *even* the mighty works which thou hast done: O God, who is like to thee?
- <sup>20</sup> What afflictions many and sore hast thou shewed me! yet thou didst turn and quicken me, and broughtest me again from the depths of the earth.

- <sup>21</sup> Thou didst multiply thy righteousness, and didst turn and comfort me, and broughtest me again out of the depths of the earth.
- <sup>22</sup> I will also therefore give thanks to thee, O God, *because of* thy truth, on an instrument of psalmody: I will sing psalms to thee on the harp, O Holy One of Israel.

<sup>23</sup> My lips shall rejoice when I sing to thee; and

my soul, which thou hast redeemed.

<sup>24</sup> Moreover also my tongue shall †dwell all the day upon thy righteousness; when they shall be ashamed and confounded that seek my hurt.

O God, give thy judgment to the king, and thy righteousness to the king's son;

<sup>2</sup> that he may judge thy people with righteous-

ness, and thy poor with judgment.

<sup>3</sup> Let the mountains and the hills raise peace to

thy people:

- <sup>4</sup> he shall judge the poor of the people in righteousness, and save the children of the needy; and shall bring low the false accuser.
- <sup>5</sup> And he shall continue as long as the sun, and before the moon for ever.
- <sup>6</sup> He shall come down as rain upon a fleece; and as drops falling upon the earth.
- <sup>7</sup> In his days shall righteousness spring up; and abundance of peace till the moon be removed.
- <sup>8</sup> And he shall have dominion from sea to sea, and from the river to the ends of the earth.

<sup>9</sup> The Ethiopians shall fall down before him; and his enemies shall lick the dust.

<sup>10</sup> The kings of Tharsis, and the isles, shall bring presents: the kings of the Arabians and Saba shall offer gifts.

<sup>11</sup> And all kings shall worship him; all the Gentiles shall serve him.

<sup>12</sup> For he has delivered the poor from the oppressor; and the needy who had no helper.

- <sup>13</sup> He shall spare the poor and needy, and shall deliver the souls of the needy.
- <sup>14</sup> He shall redeem their souls from usury and injustice: and their name *shall be* precious before him.
- <sup>15</sup> And he shall live, and there shall be given him of the gold of Arabia: and *men* shall pray for him continually; *and* all the day shall they praise him.
- 16 There shall be an establishment on the earth on the tops of the mountains: the fruit thereof shall be exalted above Libanus, and they of the city shall flourish as grass of the earth.
- <sup>17</sup> Let his name be blessed for ever: his name shall endure \*longer than the sun: and all the tribes of the earth shall be blessed in him: all nations shall call him blessed.
- <sup>18</sup> Blessed is the Lord God of Israel, who alone does wonders.
- <sup>19</sup> And blessed is his glorious name for ever, even for ever and ever: and all the earth shall be filled with his glory. So be it, so be it.

How good is God to Israel, to the upright in heart!

<sup>2</sup> But my feet were almost overthrown; my

goings very nearly slipped.

<sup>3</sup> For I was jealous of the transgressors, behold-

ing the tranquillity of sinners.

<sup>4</sup> For there is no sign of reluctance in their death: and *they have* firmness under their affliction.

<sup>5</sup> They are not in the troubles of *other* men; and

they shall not be scourged with *other* men.

<sup>6</sup> Therefore pride has possessed them; they have clothed themselves with their injustice and ungodliness.

<sup>7</sup>Their injustice shall go forth as out of fatness:

they have fulfilled their intention.

- <sup>8</sup> They have taken counsel and spoken in wickedness: they have uttered unrighteousness loftily.
- <sup>9</sup> They have set their mouth against heaven, and their tongue has gone through upon the earth.

10 Therefore shall my people return hither:

and full days shall be found \*with them.

- <sup>11</sup> And they said, How does God know? and †is there knowledge in the Most High?
- <sup>12</sup> Behold, these *are* the sinners, and they that prosper always: they have possessed wealth.
- <sup>13</sup> And I said, Verily in vain have I justified my heart, and washed my hands in innocency.

- <sup>14</sup> For I was plagued all the day, and my reproof was every morning.
- <sup>15</sup> If I said, I will speak thus; behold, I *should* have broken covenant with the generation of thy children.

<sup>16</sup> And I undertook to understand this, *but* it is

too hard for me,

<sup>17</sup> until I go into the sanctuary of God; and so

understand the latter end.

- <sup>18</sup> Surely thou hast appointed *judgments* to them because of their crafty dealings: thou hast cast them down when they were lifted up.
- <sup>19</sup> How have they become desolate! suddenly they have failed: they have perished because of their iniquity.
- <sup>20</sup> As the dream of one awakening, O Lord, in thy city thou wilt despise their image.
- <sup>21</sup> For my heart has rejoiced, and my reins have been ‡gladdened.
- <sup>22</sup> But I *was* vile and knew not: I became brutish before thee.

23 Yet I am continually with thee: thou hast

holden my right hand.

- <sup>24</sup> Thou hast guided me by thy counsel, and thou hast taken me to thyself with glory.
- <sup>25</sup> For what have I in heaven *but thee*? and what have I desired upon the earth beside thee?
- <sup>26</sup> My heart and my flesh have failed: *but* God *is the strength* of my heart, and God is my portion for ever.
- <sup>27</sup> For, behold, they that remove themselves far from thee shall perish: thou hast destroyed every one that goes a whoring from thee.

<sup>28</sup> But it is good for me to cleave close to God, to put my trust in the Lord; that I may proclaim all thy praises in the gates of the daughter of Sion.

Wherefore hast thou rejected us, O God, for ever? wherefore is thy wrath kindled against the sheep of thy pasture?

<sup>2</sup> Remember thy congregation which thou hast purchased from the beginning; thou didst ransom the rod of thine inheritance; this mount Sion wherein thou hast dwelt.

<sup>3</sup> Lift up thine hands against their pride continually; because of all that the enemy has done

wickedly in thy holy places.

- <sup>4</sup> And they that hate thee have boasted in the midst of thy feast; they have set up their standards for signs,
  - <sup>5</sup> ignorantly as it were in the entrance above;
- <sup>6</sup> they cut down its doors at once with axes as in a wood of trees; they have broken it down with hatchet and stone cutter.

<sup>7</sup> They have burnt thy sanctuary with fire to the ground; they have profaned the †habitation of thy name.

8 They have said in their heart, even all their kindred together, Come, let us abolish the feasts of the Lord from the earth.

<sup>9</sup> We have not seen our signs; there is no longer a prophet; and *God* will not know us any more.

- <sup>10</sup> How long, O God, shall the enemy reproach? shall the enemy provoke thy name for ever?
- <sup>11</sup> Wherefore turnest thou away thine hand, and thy right hand from the midst of thy bosom for ever?

12 But God is our King ‡of old; he has wrought

salvation in the midst of the earth.

<sup>13</sup> Thou didst establish the sea, in thy might, thou didst break to pieces the heads of the §dragons in the water.

- <sup>14</sup> Thou didst break to pieces the heads of the dragon; thou didst give him *for* meat to the Ethiopian nations.
- <sup>15</sup> Thou didst cleave fountains and torrents; thou driedst up \*\*mighty rivers.
- <sup>16</sup> The day is thine, and the night is thine; thou hast prepared the sun and the moon.
- <sup>17</sup> Thou hast made all the borders of the earth; thou hast made summer and spring.
- <sup>18</sup> Remember this thy creation: an enemy has reproached the Lord, and a foolish people has provoked thy name.
- 19 Deliver not to the wild beasts a soul that gives praise to thee: forget not for ever the souls of thy poor.
- <sup>20</sup> Look upon thy covenant: for the dark *places* of the earth are filled with the habitations of iniquity.
- <sup>21</sup> Let not the afflicted and shamed one be rejected: the poor and needy shall praise thy name.

- <sup>22</sup> Arise, O God, plead thy cause: remember thy reproaches that come from the foolish one all the day.
- <sup>23</sup> Forget not the voice of thy suppliants: let the pride of them that hate thee continually ascend before thee.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, Destroy not, a Psalm of a Song for Asaph.
- <sup>2</sup> We will give thanks to thee, O God, we will give thanks, and call upon thy name: I will declare all thy wonderful works.
- <sup>3</sup> When I shall take a set time, I will judge righteously.
- <sup>4</sup> The earth is dissolved, and all that dwell in it: I have strengthened its pillars. Pause.
- <sup>5</sup> I said unto the transgressors, Do not transgress; and to the sinners, Lift not up the horn.
- <sup>6</sup> Lift not up your horn on high; speak not unrighteousness against God.
- <sup>7</sup> For *good comes* neither from the east, nor from the west, nor from the desert mountains.
- <sup>8</sup> For God is the judge; he puts down one, and raises up another.
- <sup>9</sup> For *there is* a cup in the hand of the Lord, full of unmingled wine; and he has \*turned *it* from side to side, but its dregs have not been wholly poured out; all the sinners of the earth shall drink *them*.

- <sup>10</sup> But I will exult for ever: I will sing praises to the God of Jacob.
- <sup>11</sup> And I will break all the horns of sinners; but the horns of the righteous one shall be exalted.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, among the Hymns, a Psalm for Asaph; a Song for the Assyrian.
- <sup>2</sup> God is known in Judea; his name is great in Israel.
- <sup>3</sup> And his place has been in \*peace, and his dwelling-place in Sion.
- <sup>4</sup> There he broke the power of the bows, the shield, and the sword, and the battle. Pause.
- <sup>5</sup> Thou dost wonderfully shine forth from the everlasting mountains.
- <sup>6</sup> All the simple ones in heart were troubled; all the men of wealth have slept their sleep, and have found nothing in their hands.
- <sup>7</sup> At thy rebuke, O God of Jacob, the riders on horses slumbered.
- <sup>8</sup> Thou art terrible; and who shall withstand thee, because of thine anger?
- <sup>9</sup> Thou didst cause judgment to be heard from heaven; the earth feared, and was still,
- <sup>10</sup> when God arose to judgment, to save all the meek in heart. Pause.
- <sup>11</sup> For the inward thought of man shall give thanks to thee: and the memorial of his inward thought shall keep a feast to thee.

- <sup>12</sup> Vow, and pay *your vows* to the Lord our God; all that are round about him shall bring gifts, *even* to him that is terrible,
- <sup>13</sup> and that takes away the spirits of princes; to him that is terrible among the kings of the earth.

- <sup>1</sup> For the end, for Idithun, a Psalm of Asaph.
- <sup>2</sup> I cried to the Lord with my voice, yea, my voice *was addressed* to God; and he gave heed to me
- <sup>3</sup> In the day of mine affliction I earnestly sought the Lord; *even* with my hands by night before him, and I was not deceived; my soul refused to be comforted.
- <sup>4</sup>I remembered God, and rejoiced; I poured out my complaint, and my soul fainted. Pause.
- <sup>5</sup> All mine enemies set a watch *against me*: I was troubled, and spoke not.
- <sup>6</sup> I considered the days of old, and remembered ancient years.
- <sup>7</sup> And I meditated; I communed with my heart by night, and diligently searched my spirit, *saying*,
- <sup>8</sup> Will the Lord cast off for ever? and will he be well pleased no more?
- <sup>9</sup> Will he cut off his mercy for ever, even for ever and ever?
- <sup>10</sup> Will God forget to pity? or will he shut up his compassions in his wrath? Pause.
- <sup>11</sup> And I said, Now I have begun; this is the change of the right hand of the Most High.
- <sup>12</sup> I remembered the works of the Lord; for I will remember thy wonders from the beginning.

- <sup>13</sup> And I will meditate on all thy works, and will consider thy doings.
- <sup>14</sup> O God, thy way is in the sanctuary; who is a great God as our God?
- <sup>15</sup> Thou art the God that doest wonders; thou hast made known thy power among the nations.
- <sup>16</sup> Thou hast with thine arm redeemed thy people, the sons of Jacob and Joseph. Pause.
- <sup>17</sup> The waters saw thee, O God, the waters saw thee, and feared; and the depths were troubled.
- <sup>18</sup> There was an abundant sound of waters: the clouds uttered a voice; for thine arrows went abroad.
- <sup>19</sup> The voice of thy thunder was abroad, and around thy lightnings appeared to the world; the earth trembled and quaked.
- <sup>20</sup> Thy way is in the sea, and thy paths in many waters, and thy footsteps cannot be known.
- <sup>21</sup> Thou didst guide thy people as sheep by the hand of Moses and Aaron.

Give heed, O my people, to my law: incline your ear to the words of my mouth.

- <sup>2</sup> \* I will open my mouth in parables: I will utter dark sayings *which have been* from the beginning.
- <sup>3</sup> All which we have heard and known, and our fathers have declared to us.
- <sup>4</sup> They were not hid from their children to a second generation; *the fathers* declaring the

praises of the Lord, and his mighty acts, and his wonders which he wrought.

- <sup>5</sup> And he raised up a testimony in Jacob, and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers, to make it known to their children:
- <sup>6</sup> that another generation might know, even the sons which should be born; and they should arise and declare them to their children.

<sup>7</sup> That they might set their hope on God, and not forget the works of God, but diligently seek

his commandments.

<sup>8</sup> That they should not be as their fathers, a perverse and provoking generation; a generation which set not its heart aright, and its spirit was not †steadfast with God.

<sup>9</sup> The children of Ephraim, bending and shooting *with* the bow, turned *back* in the day of battle.

<sup>10</sup> They kept not the covenant of God, and would not walk in his law.

<sup>11</sup> And they forgot his benefits, and his miracles

which he had shewed them;

- <sup>12</sup> the miracles which he wrought before their fathers, in the land of Egypt, in the plain of Tanes.
- <sup>13</sup> He clave the sea, and led them through: he made the waters to stand as *in* a bottle.

<sup>14</sup> And he guided them with a cloud by day, and

all the night with a light of fire.

- <sup>15</sup> He clave a rock in the wilderness, and made them drink as in a great deep.
  - <sup>16</sup> And he brought water out of the rock, and

caused waters to flow down as rivers.

<sup>17</sup> And they sinned yet more against him; they provoked the Most High in the wilderness.

<sup>† 77:8</sup> Or, faithfully secured.

- <sup>18</sup> And they tempted God in their hearts, in asking meat for *the desire of* their souls.
- <sup>19</sup> They spoke also against God, and said, Will God be able to prepare a table in the wilderness?
- <sup>20</sup> Forasmuch as he smote the rock, and the waters flowed, and the torrents ran abundantly; will he be able also to give bread, or prepare a table for his people?
- <sup>21</sup> Therefore the Lord heard, and was provoked: and fire was kindled in Jacob, and wrath went up against Israel.
- <sup>22</sup> Because they believed not in God, and trusted not in his salvation.
- <sup>23</sup> Yet he commanded the clouds from above, and opened the doors of heaven,
- <sup>24</sup> and rained upon them manna to eat, and gave them the bread of heaven.
- $^{25}$  Man ate angels' bread;  $^{*}$  he sent them provision to the full.
- <sup>26</sup> He removed the south wind from heaven; and by his might he brought in the south-west wind.
- <sup>27</sup> And he rained upon them flesh like dust, and feathered birds like the sand of the seas.
- <sup>28</sup> And they fell into the midst of their camp, round about their tents.
- <sup>29</sup> So they ate, and were completely filled; and he gave them their desire.
- <sup>30</sup> They were not disappointed of their desire: *but* when their food was yet in their mouth,

- <sup>31</sup> then the indignation of God rose up against them, and slew the fattest of them, and overthrew the choice men of Israel.
- <sup>32</sup> In the midst of all this they sinned yet more, and believed not his miracles.

<sup>33</sup> And their days were consumed in vanity, and their years with anxiety.

<sup>34</sup> When he slew them, they sought him: and they returned and called betimes upon God.

<sup>35</sup> And they remembered that God was their helper, and the most high God was their redeemer.

<sup>36</sup> Yet they loved him *only* with their mouth,

and lied to him with their tongue.

- <sup>37</sup> For their heart *was* not right with him, neither were they steadfast in his covenant.
- <sup>38</sup> But he is compassionate, and will ‡forgive their sins, and will not destroy *them*: yea, he will frequently turn away his wrath, and will not kindle all his anger.
- <sup>39</sup> And he remembered that they are flesh; a wind that passes away, and returns not.
- <sup>40</sup> How often did they provoke him in the wilderness, *and* anger him in a dry land!
- <sup>41</sup> Yea, they turned back, and tempted God, and provoked the Holy One of Israel.
- <sup>42</sup> They remembered not his hand, the day in which he delivered them from the hand of the oppressor.
- <sup>43</sup> How he had wrought his signs in Egypt, and his wonders in the field of Tanes:

<sup>‡</sup> **77:38** *Gr.* be propitious, *or*, merciful to.

- <sup>44</sup> and had changed their rivers into blood; and their §streams, that they should not drink.
- <sup>45</sup> He sent against them the dog-fly, and it devoured them; and the frog, and it spoiled them.

<sup>46</sup> And he gave their fruit to the canker worm,

and their labours to the locust.

<sup>47</sup> He killed their vines with hail, and their sycamores with frost.

<sup>48</sup> And he gave up their cattle to hail, and their

substance to the fire.

- <sup>49</sup> He sent out against them the fury of his anger, wrath, and indignation, and affliction, a message by evil angels.

- <sup>65</sup> So the Lord awaked as one out of sleep, *and* as a mighty man who has been heated with wine.
- 66 And he smote his enemies in the hinder parts: he brought on them a perpetual reproach.
- <sup>67</sup> And he rejected the tabernacle of Joseph, and chose not the tribe of Ephraim;
- <sup>68</sup> but chose the tribe of Juda, the mount Sion which he loved.

- <sup>8</sup> Remember not our old transgressions; let thy tender mercies speedily prevent us; for we are greatly impoverished.

- <sup>9</sup> Help us, O God our Saviour; for the glory of thy name, O Lord, deliver us; and be merciful to our sins, for thy name's sake.
- <sup>10</sup> Lest haply they should say among the heathen, Where is their God? and let the avenging of thy servants' blood that has been shed be known among the heathen before our eyes.
- <sup>11</sup> Let the groaning of the prisoners come in before thee; according to the greatness of thine arm preserve the \*sons of the slain ones.
- <sup>12</sup> Repay to our neighbours sevenfold into their bosom their reproach, with which they have reproached thee, O Lord.

<sup>30</sup> Thou shalt send forth thy Spirit, and they shall be created; and thou shalt renew the face

of the earth.

- <sup>31</sup> Let the glory of the Lord be for ever: the Lord shall rejoice in his works;
- <sup>32</sup> who looks upon the earth, and makes it tremble; who touches the mountains, and they smoke.

33 I will sing to the Lord while I live; I will sing

praise to my God while I exist.

- <sup>34</sup> Let my meditation be sweet to him: and I will rejoice in the Lord.
- <sup>35</sup> Let the sinners fail from off the earth, and transgressors, so that they shall be no more. Bless the Lord, O my soul.

# 104

<sup>1</sup> Alleluią.

Give thanks to the Lord, and call upon his name; declare his works among the heathen.

- <sup>2</sup> Sing to him, yea, sing praises to him: tell forth all his wonderful works.
- <sup>3</sup> Glory in his holy name: let the heart of them that seek the Lord rejoice.
- <sup>4</sup> Seek ye the Lord, and be strengthened; seek his face continually.
- <sup>5</sup> Remember his wonderful works that he has done; his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth;
- <sup>6</sup> ye seed of Abraam, his servants, ye children of Jacob, his chosen ones.
- <sup>7</sup> He is the Lord our God; his judgments are in all the earth.
- <sup>8</sup> He has remembered his covenant for ever, the word which he commanded for a thousand generations:
- <sup>9</sup> which he established as a covenant to Abraam, and *he remembered* his oath to Isaac.
- <sup>10</sup> And he established it to Jacob for an ordinance, and to Israel for an everlasting covenant;
- <sup>11</sup> saying, To thee will I give the land of Chanaan, the line of your inheritance:
- <sup>12</sup> when they were few in number, very few, and sojourners in it.
- <sup>13</sup> And they went from nation to nation, and from *one* kingdom to another people.
- <sup>14</sup> He suffered no man to wrong them; and he rebuked kings for their sakes:
- <sup>15</sup> *saying*, Touch not my anointed ones; and do my prophets no harm.
- <sup>16</sup> Moreover he called for a famine upon the land; he broke the whole support of bread.

- <sup>17</sup> He sent a man before them; Joseph was sold for a slave.
- 18 They \*hurt his feet with fetters; †his soul passed into iron,

<sup>19</sup> until the time that his cause came on; the

word of the Lord tried him as fire.

<sup>20</sup> The king sent and loosed him; *even* the prince of the people, and let him go free.

<sup>21</sup> He made him lord over his house, and ruler

of all his substance;

<sup>22</sup> to chastise his rulers at his pleasure, and to teach his elders wisdom.

<sup>23</sup> Israel also came into Egypt, and Jacob

sojourned in the land of Cham.

- <sup>24</sup> And he increased his people greatly, and made them stronger than their enemies.
- <sup>25</sup> And he turned their heart to hate his people, to deal craftily with his servants.

<sup>26</sup> He sent forth Moses his servant, and Aaron

whom he had chosen.

<sup>27</sup> He established among them his signs, and *his* wonders in the land of Cham.

<sup>28</sup> He sent forth darkness, and made it dark;

yet they rebelled against his words.

- <sup>29</sup> He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.
- <sup>30</sup> Their land produced frogs abundantly, in the chambers of their kings.
- <sup>31</sup> He spoke, and the dog-fly came, and lice in all their coasts.
- <sup>32</sup> He turned their rain into hail, *and sent* flaming fire in their land.

- <sup>33</sup> And he smote their vines and their fig-trees; and broke every tree of their coast.
- <sup>34</sup> He spoke, and the locust came, and caterpillars innumerable,
- <sup>35</sup> and devoured all the grass in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground.

<sup>36</sup> He smote also every first-born of their land,

the first-fruits of all their labour.

- <sup>37</sup> And he brought them out with silver and gold; and there was not a feeble one among their tribes.
- <sup>38</sup> Egypt rejoiced at their departing; for the fear of them fell upon them.
- <sup>39</sup> He spread out a cloud for a covering to them, and fire to give them light by night.
- <sup>40</sup> They asked, and the quail came, and he satisfied them with the bread of heaven.
- <sup>41</sup> He clave the rock, and the waters flowed; rivers ran in dry places.
- <sup>42</sup> For he remembered his holy word, which *he promised* to Abraam his servant.
- <sup>43</sup> And he brought out his people with exultation, and his chosen with joy;
- <sup>44</sup> and gave them the lands of the heathen; and they inherited the labours of the people;
- <sup>45</sup> that they might keep his ordinances, and diligently seek his law.

# **105**

#### <sup>1</sup> Alleluia.

Give thanks to the Lord; for he is good: for his mercy *endures* for ever.

- <sup>2</sup> Who shall tell the mighty acts of the Lord? *who* shall cause all his praises to be heard?
- <sup>3</sup> Blessed are they that keep judgment, and do righteousness at all times.
- <sup>4</sup> Remember us, O Lord, with the favour *thou hast* to thy people: visit us with thy salvation;
- <sup>5</sup> that we may behold the good of thine elect, that we may rejoice in the gladness of thy nation, that we may glory with thine inheritance.
- <sup>6</sup> We have sinned with our fathers, we have transgressed, we have done unrighteously.
- <sup>7</sup> Our fathers in Egypt understood not thy wonders, and remembered not the multitude of thy mercy; but provoked *him* as they went up by the Red Sea.
- <sup>8</sup> Yet he saved them for his name's sake, that he might cause his mighty power to be known.
- <sup>9</sup> And he rebuked the Red Sea, and it was dried up: so he led them through the deep as through the wilderness.
- <sup>10</sup> And he saved them out of the hand of them that hated *them*, and redeemed them out of the hand of the enemy.
- <sup>11</sup> The water covered those that oppressed them: there was not one of them left.

<sup>12</sup> Then they believed his words, and celebrated his praise.

<sup>13</sup> They made haste, they forgot his works; they waited not for his counsel.

- <sup>14</sup> And they lusted exceedingly in the wilderness, and tempted God in the dry *land*.
- <sup>15</sup> And he gave them their request, and sent fulness into their souls.

- <sup>16</sup> They provoked Moses also in the camp, and Aaron the holy one of the Lord.
- <sup>17</sup> The earth opened and swallowed up Dathan, and closed upon the congregation of Abiron.
- <sup>18</sup> And a fire was kindled in their congregation, and a flame burnt up the sinners.
- <sup>19</sup> And they made a calf in Choreb, and worshipped the graven image,

<sup>20</sup> and they changed their glory into the simil-

itude of a calf that feeds on grass.

<sup>21</sup> They forgot God that saved them, who had wrought great deeds in Egypt;

<sup>22</sup> wondrous works in the land of Cham, and

terrible things at the Red Sea.

- <sup>23</sup> So he said that he would have destroyed them, had not Moses his chosen stood before him in the breach, to turn *him* away from the fierceness of his anger, so that he should not destroy them.
- <sup>24</sup> Moreover they set at nought the desirable land, and believed not his word.

<sup>25</sup> And they murmured in their tents: they

hearkened not to the voice of the Lord.

- <sup>26</sup> So he lifted up his hand against them, to cast them down in the wilderness;
- <sup>27</sup> and to cast down their seed among the nations, and to scatter them in the countries.
- <sup>28</sup> They were joined also to Beelphegor, and ate the sacrifices of the dead. And they provoked him with their devices;
  - <sup>29</sup> and destruction was multiplied among them.
- <sup>30</sup> Then Phinees stood up, and made atonement: and the plague ceased.

- <sup>31</sup> And it was counted to him for righteousness, to all generations for ever.
- <sup>32</sup> They provoked him also at the water of Strife, and Moses was hurt for their sakes;
- <sup>33</sup> for they provoked his spirit, and he \*spoke *unadvisedly* with his lips.
- <sup>34</sup> They destroyed not the nations which the Lord told them *to destroy*;
- <sup>35</sup> but were mingled with the heathen, and learned their works.

<sup>36</sup> And they served their graven images; and it

became an offence to them.

- <sup>37</sup> And they sacrificed their sons and their daughters to devils,
- <sup>38</sup> and shed innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daughters, whom they sacrificed to the idols of Chanaan; and the land was †defiled with blood,
- <sup>39</sup> and was polluted with their works; and they went a whoring with their own devices.

<sup>40</sup> So the Lord was very angry with his people,

and he abhorred his inheritance.

<sup>41</sup> And he delivered them into the hands of *their* enemies; and they that hated them ruled over them.

<sup>42</sup> And their enemies oppressed them, and they

were brought down under their hands.

- <sup>43</sup> Many a time he delivered them; but they provoked him by their counsel, and they were brought low by their iniquities.
- <sup>44</sup> Yet the Lord looked upon their affliction, when he heard their petition.

<sup>47</sup> Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the heathen, that we may give thanks to thy holy name, that we may glory in thy praise.

<sup>48</sup> Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting and to everlasting; and all the people shall say, Amen, Amen.

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his mercy *endures* for ever.

- <sup>12</sup> So their heart was brought low with troubles; they were weak, and there was no helper.
- <sup>13</sup> Then they cried to the Lord in their affliction, and he saved them out of their distresses.
- <sup>14</sup> And he brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, and broke their bonds asunder.
- <sup>15</sup> Let them acknowledge to the Lord his mercies, and his wonders to the children of men.
- <sup>16</sup> For he broke to pieces the brazen gates, and crushed the iron bars.
- $^{17}$  ‡He helped them out of the way of their iniquity; for they were brought low because of their iniquities.
- <sup>18</sup> Their soul abhorred all meat; and they drew near to the gates of death.
- <sup>19</sup> Then they cried to the Lord in their affliction, and he saved them out of their distresses.
- <sup>20</sup> He sent his word, and healed them, and delivered them out of their destructions.
- <sup>21</sup> Let them acknowledge to the Lord his mercies, and his wonderful works to the children of men.

- <sup>23</sup> They that go down to the sea in ships, doing business in many waters;

- <sup>24</sup> these *men* have seen the works of the Lord, and his wonders in the deep.

- <sup>26</sup> They go up to the heavens, and go down to the depths; their soul melts because of troubles.
- <sup>27</sup> They are troubled, they stagger as a drunkard, and all their wisdom is swallowed up.
- <sup>28</sup> Then they cry to the Lord in their affliction, and he brings them out of their distresses.
- <sup>29</sup> And he commands the storm, and it is calmed into a gentle breeze, and its waves are still.
- <sup>30</sup> And they are glad, because they are quiet; and he guides them to their desired haven.
- <sup>31</sup> Let them acknowledge to the Lord his mercies, and his wonderful works to the children of men.
- <sup>32</sup> Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people, and praise him in the seat of the elders.
- <sup>33</sup> He turns rivers into a desert, and streams of §water into \*\*a dry land;
- <sup>34</sup> a fruitful land into saltness, for the wickedness of them that dwell in it.
- <sup>35</sup> He turns a wilderness into pools of water, and a dry land into streams of water.
- <sup>36</sup> And there he causes the hungry to dwell, and they establish for themselves cities of habitation.
- <sup>37</sup> And they sow fields, and plant vineyards, and they yield fruit of increase.

- <sup>38</sup> And he blesses them, and they multiply exceedingly, and he diminishes not the number of their cattle.

- <sup>40</sup> Contempt is poured upon their princes, and he causes them to wander in a desert and trackless land.

<sup>41</sup> But he helps the poor out of poverty, and

makes him families as a flock.

- <sup>42</sup> The upright shall see and rejoice; and all iniquity shall stop her mouth.
- <sup>43</sup> Who is wise, and will observe these things, and understand the mercies of the Lord?

- <sup>2</sup> O God, my heart is ready, my heart is ready; I will sing and sing psalms with my glory.

- <sup>12</sup> Wilt not thou, O God, who hast rejected us? and wilt not thou, O God, go forth with our hosts?
- <sup>13</sup> Give us help from tribulation: for vain is the help of man.
- <sup>14</sup> Through God we shall \*do valiantly; and he will bring to nought our enemies.

<sup>12</sup> Let him have no helper; neither let there be any one to have compassion on his fatherless children.

<sup>13</sup> Let his children be *given up* to utter destruction: in one generation let his name be blotted

out.

<sup>14</sup> Let the iniquity of his fathers be remembered before the Lord; and let not the sin of his mother be blotted out.

<sup>15</sup> Let them be before the Lord continually; and let their memorial be blotted out from the earth.

- <sup>22</sup> Deliver me, for I am poor and needy; and my heart is troubled within me.
- <sup>23</sup> I am removed as a shadow in its going down: I am tossed up and down like locusts.
- <sup>24</sup> My knees are weakened through fasting, and my flesh is changed by reason of *the want of* oil.
- <sup>25</sup> I became also a reproach to them: *when* they saw me they shook their heads.

- <sup>7</sup> The earth trembled at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob;
