

# The Book of Psalms

## 1

<sup>1</sup> “BOOK I” Happy the man who walketh not in the counsel of the unrighteous, Nor standeth in the way of sinners, Nor sitteth in the seat of scoffers; <sup>2</sup> But whose delight is in the law of the LORD, And who meditateth on his precepts day and night. <sup>3</sup> He is like a tree planted by streams of water, That bringeth forth its fruit in its season, Whose leaves also do not wither: All that he doeth shall prosper. <sup>4</sup> Not so the unrighteous; They are like chaff, which the wind driveth away. <sup>5</sup> Therefore the wicked shall not stand in judgment, Nor sinners in the assembly of the just. <sup>6</sup> For the LORD knoweth the way of the righteous, But the way of the wicked leadeth to ruin.

## 2

<sup>1</sup> Why do the heathen rage, And the nations meditate a vain thing? <sup>2</sup> Why do the kings of the earth rise up, And the princes combine together, Against Jehovah, and against his anointed king? <sup>3</sup> “Let us break their bonds asunder; Let us cast away from us their fetters!” <sup>4</sup> He that sitteth in heaven will laugh; The Lord will have them in derision. <sup>5</sup> Then shall he speak to them in his wrath, And confound them in his hot displeasure. <sup>6</sup> “I myself have anointed my king, Upon Zion, my holy hill!” <sup>7</sup> I will declare the

decree of Jehovah: He hath said to me, "Thou art my son; This day I have begotten thee. <sup>8</sup> Ask of me, and I will give thee the nations for thine inheritance, And the ends of the earth for thy possession. <sup>9</sup> Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; Thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." <sup>10</sup> Be wise, therefore, O ye kings! Be admonished, ye rulers of the earth! <sup>11</sup> Be subject to Jehovah with awe, And fear with trembling! <sup>12</sup> Kiss the son, lest He be angry, and ye perish in your way; For soon shall his wrath be kindled. Happy are all they who seek refuge in him.

### 3

<sup>1</sup> "A Psalm of David, when he fled from his son Absalom." How many, O LORD, are mine enemies! How many are they who rise up against me! <sup>2</sup> How many are they who say of me, "There is no help for him with God"! [[Pause.]] <sup>3</sup> But thou, O LORD! art my shield, My glory, and the lifter-up of my head. <sup>4</sup> I call upon the LORD with my voice, And he heareth me from his holy hill. [[Pause.]] <sup>5</sup> I lay me down and sleep; I awake, for the LORD sustaineth me. <sup>6</sup> I will not fear the ten thousands of people Who on every side set themselves against me. <sup>7</sup> Arise, O LORD! Save me, O my God! For thou smitest the cheek of all my enemies; Thou breakest the teeth of the wicked. <sup>8</sup> Deliverance cometh from the LORD: May thy blessing be with thy people! [[Pause.]]

## 4

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music; to be accompanied with stringed instruments. A psalm of David.” Hear me, when I call, O God of my righteousness! Thou hast helped me, when I was in trouble,—Have pity upon me, and hear my prayer! <sup>2</sup> How long, O men! will ye dishonor my dignity? How long will ye love vanity, and seek disappointment? [[Pause.]] <sup>3</sup> Know ye that the LORD hath exalted one that is devoted to him; The LORD will hear, when I call upon him. <sup>4</sup> Stand in awe, and sin no more; Commune with your hearts upon your beds, and desist! [[Pause.]] <sup>5</sup> Offer sacrifices of righteousness, And put your trust in the LORD! <sup>6</sup> There are many who say, Who will show us any good? LORD, lift thou up the light of thy countenance upon us! <sup>7</sup> Thou puttest gladness into my heart, Greater than theirs, when their corn and wine are abundant. <sup>8</sup> I will lay me down in peace, and sleep: For thou alone, O LORD! makest me dwell in safety.

## 5

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music; to be accompanied with wind instruments. A psalm of David.” Give ear to my words, O LORD; Have regard to my cry! <sup>2</sup> Listen to the voice of my supplication, my King and my God! For to thee do I address my prayer. <sup>3</sup> In the morning shalt thou hear my voice, O LORD! In the morning will I address my prayer to thee, and look for help. <sup>4</sup> For thou art not a God that hath pleasure in

wickedness; The unrighteous man dwelleth not with thee. <sup>5</sup> The haughty shall not stand in thy sight; Thou hatest all that do iniquity. <sup>6</sup> Thou destroyest them that speak falsehood; The man of blood and deceit the LORD abhorreth. <sup>7</sup> But I, through thy great goodness, will come to thy house; In thy fear will I worship at thy holy temple. <sup>8</sup> Lead me, O LORD! in thy righteousness, because of mine enemies; Make thy path straight before my face! <sup>9</sup> For in their mouth there is no truth; Their heart is malignity; Their throat is an open sepulchre; They flatter with their tongue. <sup>10</sup> Requite them, O God! Let them be confounded in their devices; Cast them out for the multitude of their transgressions; For against thee have they rebelled! <sup>11</sup> But let all, that put their trust in thee, rejoice; Let them ever shout for joy, because thou defendest them; Let them, that love thy name, be joyful in thee! <sup>12</sup> For thou, O LORD! dost bless the righteous; With favor dost thou encompass him, as with a shield.

## 6

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music; to be accompanied with stringed instruments; to the octave. A psalm of David.” O LORD! rebuke me not in thine anger; Chasten me not in thy hot displeasure! <sup>2</sup> Have pity upon me, O LORD! for I am weak; Heal me, O LORD! for my bones tremble! <sup>3</sup> My soul, also, is sore troubled; And thou, O LORD! how long—? <sup>4</sup> Return, O LORD! and deliver me; Oh, save me according to thy mercy! <sup>5</sup> For in death no praise is given to thee; In the

underworld who can give thee thanks? <sup>6</sup> I am weary with my groaning; All the night I make my bed to swim, And drench my couch with my tears. <sup>7</sup> Mine eye is wasted with grief; It hath become old because of all my enemies. <sup>8</sup> Depart from me, all ye that do iniquity; For the LORD heareth the voice of my weeping. <sup>9</sup> The LORD heareth my supplication; The LORD accepteth my prayer. <sup>10</sup> All my enemies shall be ashamed and utterly confounded; They shall be turned back, and put to shame suddenly.

## 7

<sup>1</sup> “A psalm of David, which he sang to Jehovah, on account of the reproaches of Cush the Benjamite.” O Jehovah, my God! to thee do I look for help; Save me from them that persecute me, and deliver me! <sup>2</sup> Lest mine enemy tear me like a lion; Lest he rend me in pieces, while there is none to help. <sup>3</sup> O Jehovah, my God! if I have done this,—If there be iniquity upon my hands, <sup>4</sup> If I have rendered evil to my friend, Or have despoiled him that without cause is mine enemy,— <sup>5</sup> Let my adversary pursue and take me; Let him trample me to the ground, And lay me prostrate in the dust! [[Pause.]] <sup>6</sup> Arise, O LORD! in thine anger; Lift thyself up against the rage of mine enemies; Awake for me, ordain judgment! <sup>7</sup> Let the assembly of the nations compass thee about, And on their account return to the height! <sup>8</sup> The LORD judgeth the nations; Judge me, O LORD! according to my righteousness, And requite me according to my

integrity! <sup>9</sup> Oh, let the wickedness of the wicked be at an end; But establish the righteous! For the righteous God trieth the heart and the reins. <sup>10</sup> My shield is with God, Who saveth the upright in heart. <sup>11</sup> God is a righteous judge, And a God who is angry every day. <sup>12</sup> If he do not desist, He sharpeneth his sword; He bendeth his bow, and maketh it ready; <sup>13</sup> He prepareth for him the instruments of death; He shooteth his burning arrows. <sup>14</sup> Behold, he travailed with iniquity, And conceived mischief, But hath brought forth disappointment! <sup>15</sup> He made a pit and digged it. And is fallen into the ditch which he made. <sup>16</sup> His mischief returneth upon his own head, And his violence cometh down upon his own skull. <sup>17</sup> I will praise the LORD according to his righteousness; I will sing praise to the name of the LORD most high.

## 8

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music; to be accompanied with the gittith. A psalm of David.” O Jehovah, our Lord! How excellent is thy name in all the earth! Thou hast set thy glory above the heavens. <sup>2</sup> Out of the mouths of babes and sucklings hast thou ordained praise, To put thine adversaries to shame, And to silence the enemy and avenger. <sup>3</sup> When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, The moon and the stars which thou hast ordained: <sup>4</sup> What is man, that thou art mindful of him, And the son of man, that thou carest for him? <sup>5</sup> Yet thou hast made him little lower than God; Thou hast crowned

him with glory and honor. <sup>6</sup> Thou hast given him dominion over the works of thy hands; Thou hast put all things under his feet,— <sup>7</sup> All sheep and oxen, Yea, and the beasts of the forest; <sup>8</sup> The birds of the air, and the fishes of the sea, And whatever passeth through the paths of the deep. <sup>9</sup> O Jehovah, our Lord, How excellent is thy name in all the earth!

## 9

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music; to be sung in the manner or with the voice of maidens. To the Ben-ites, or to Ben. A psalm of David.” I will praise thee, O LORD! with my whole heart; I will show forth all thy marvellous works. <sup>2</sup> I will be glad and rejoice in thee: I will sing praise to thy name, O thou Most High! <sup>3</sup> All my enemies are turned back; They fall and perish at thy presence. <sup>4</sup> For thou dost defend my right and my cause; Thou sittest upon the throne, a righteous judge. <sup>5</sup> Thou rebukest the nations; Thou destroyest the wicked; Thou blottest out their name for evermore! <sup>6</sup> The enemy is fallen,—a desolation for ever! Thou, O LORD! hast destroyed their cities; Their memory itself hath perished! <sup>7</sup> The LORD reigneth for ever; He hath prepared his throne for judgment. <sup>8</sup> He judgeth the world in righteousness; He administereth judgment to the nations with uprightness. <sup>9</sup> Yea, the LORD is a refuge for the oppressed; A refuge in times of trouble. <sup>10</sup> They who know thy name put their trust in thee; For thou, O LORD! forsakest not them that seek thee! <sup>11</sup> Sing praises to the

LORD, who reigneth in Zion; Declare his doings among the people! <sup>12</sup> As the avenger of blood, he remembereth the distressed; He forgetteth not their complaint. <sup>13</sup> "Have pity upon me, [[said I,]] O LORD! Look upon my affliction through them that hate me; Lift me up from the gates of death: <sup>14</sup> That I may show forth all thy praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion; That I may rejoice in salvation by thee." <sup>15</sup> The nations have sunk into the pit which they made; In the net, which they hid, is their own foot taken. <sup>16</sup> Thus it is known that the LORD executeth judgment; The wicked are ensnared in the work of their own hands. [[Stringed instruments. Pause.]] <sup>17</sup> The wicked shall be driven into the underworld; Yea, all the nations that forger God. <sup>18</sup> For the poor shall not always be forgotten; The hopes of the afflicted shall not perish for ever. <sup>19</sup> Arise, O LORD! Let not man prevail; Let the nations be judged by thee! <sup>20</sup> Strike terror into them, O LORD! Let the nations know that they are but men! [[Pause.]]

## 10

<sup>1</sup> Why standest thou afar off, O LORD? Why hidest thou thyself in times of trouble? <sup>2</sup> Through the haughtiness of the wicked the poor are in distress; They are caught in the wiles which are contrived for them. <sup>3</sup> The wicked boasteth of his heart's desire; The rapacious renounceth and contemneth Jehovah. <sup>4</sup> The wicked [[saith]] in his haughtiness, "He careth not!" All his thoughts are, "There is no God." <sup>5</sup> His course is always prosperous; Far in the heights are thy judgments



from him; As for all his enemies, he puffeth at them. <sup>6</sup> He saith in his heart, "I shall never fall; I shall never be in adversity." <sup>7</sup> His mouth is full of perjury, deceit, and oppression; Mischief and injustice are upon his tongue. <sup>8</sup> He sitteth in the lurking-places of the villages; In secret places doth he murder the innocent; His eyes are secretly fixed upon the poor. <sup>9</sup> He secretly lieth in wait, like a lion in a thicket; He lieth in wait to seize upon the helpless; He catcheth the poor, drawing him into his net. <sup>10</sup> He croucheth, and lowereth himself, And the wretched fall into his paws. <sup>11</sup> He saith in his heart, "God doth forget; He hideth his face; he doth never see it." <sup>12</sup> Arise, O LORD! O God, lift up thine hand: Forget not the distressed! <sup>13</sup> Wherefore doth the wicked contemn God, And say in his heart, "He careth not for it"? <sup>14</sup> Thou dost see it; yea, thou beholdest malice and oppression, And markest it upon thy hand! The poor committeth himself to thee; Thou art the helper of the fatherless. <sup>15</sup> Break thou the arm of the unjust and wicked man; Seek out his wickedness, till thou canst find none! <sup>16</sup> Jehovah is king for ever and ever; The gentiles shall perish out of his land. <sup>17</sup> Thou, O LORD! wilt hear the desires of the distressed; Thou wilt strengthen their hearts; Thou wilt lend a listening ear! <sup>18</sup> Thou wilt maintain the cause of the fatherless and the oppressed, That henceforth none may be driven from the land.

## 11

<sup>1</sup> "For the leader of the music. A psalm of

David." In the LORD do I put my trust. Why say ye to me, "Flee, like a bird, to your mountain?"  
<sup>2</sup> For, lo! the wicked bend their bow; They make ready their arrows on the string, To shoot in secret at the upright in heart. <sup>3</sup> If the pillars be broken down, What can the righteous do?" <sup>4</sup> The LORD is in his holy palace; The LORD'S throne is in heaven; His eyes behold, his eyelids prove the children of men. <sup>5</sup> The LORD trieth the righteous; But the wicked, and the lover of violence, his soul hateth. <sup>6</sup> Upon the wicked he will rain lightning; Fire and brimstone and a burning wind shall be the portion of their cup. <sup>7</sup> For the LORD is righteous; he loveth righteousness; The upright shall see his face.

## 12

<sup>1</sup> "For the leader of the music; to the octave. A psalm of David." Help, LORD; for the godly man ceaseth; The faithful are failing among men.  
<sup>2</sup> They speak falsehood one to another; With flattering lips, with a double heart, do they speak.  
<sup>3</sup> May the LORD destroy all flattering lips, And the tongue which speaketh proud things! <sup>4</sup> Who say, "With our tongues will we prevail; Our lips are our reliance; Who is lord over us?" <sup>5</sup> For the oppression of the poor and the sighing of the wretched, Now will I stand up, saith the LORD; I will set in safety him whom they puff at. <sup>6</sup> The words of the LORD are pure; Like silver purified in a furnace on the earth, Seven times refined.  
<sup>7</sup> Thou, O LORD! will watch over them; Thou wilt preserve them from this generation for ever.

<sup>8</sup> The wicked walk on every side, When the vilest of men are exalted.

## 13

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music. A psalm of David.” How long, O LORD! wilt thou forget me for ever? How long wilt thou hide thy face from me? <sup>2</sup> How long shall I have anxiety in my soul for ever, And sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me? <sup>3</sup> Look down and hear me, O LORD, my God! Enlighten my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death; <sup>4</sup> Lest my enemy say, “I have prevailed against him!” Lest my adversaries rejoice, when I am fallen. <sup>5</sup> Yet will I trust in thy goodness; My heart shall rejoice in thy salvation; <sup>6</sup> I will sing to the LORD, that he hath dealt kindly with me.

## 14

<sup>1</sup> “For the leader of the music. A psalm of David.” The fool saith in his heart, “There is no God.” They are corrupt; abominable are their doings; There is none that doeth good. <sup>2</sup> Jehovah looketh down from heaven upon the children of men, To see if there are any that have understanding, That have regard to God. <sup>3</sup> They are all gone out of the way; together are they corrupt; There is none that doeth good—no, not one. <sup>4</sup> Shall not the evil-doers be requited, Who devour my people like bread, And call not upon Jehovah? <sup>5</sup> Yea, then shall they be in great fear; For Jehovah is with the race of the righteous. <sup>6</sup> Ye would put to shame the counsel of the poor; But

Jehovah is their refuge. <sup>7</sup> Oh that salvation for Israel would come out of Zion! When Jehovah bringeth back the captives of his people, Then shall Jacob rejoice, and Israel be glad.

## 15

<sup>1</sup> “A psalm of David.” LORD, who shall abide at thy tabernacle? Who shall dwell upon thy holy hill? <sup>2</sup> He that walketh uprightly, and doeth righteousness, And speaketh the truth from his heart; <sup>3</sup> He that slandereth not with his tongue, That doeth no injury to his neighbor, And uttereth no reproach against his neighbor; <sup>4</sup> In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; But who honoreth them that fear the LORD; Who sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not; <sup>5</sup> He that lendeth not his money for interest, And taketh not a bribe against the innocent: He that doeth these things shall never be moved.

## 16

<sup>1</sup> “A psalm off David.” Preserve me, O God! for to thee do I look for help. <sup>2</sup> I have said to Jehovah, Thou art my Lord; I have no happiness beyond thee! <sup>3</sup> The holy that are in the land, and the excellent,—in them is all my delight. <sup>4</sup> They who hasten after other gods shall have multiplied sorrows; Their drink-offerings of blood I will not offer, Nor will I take their names upon my lips. <sup>5</sup> Jehovah is my portion and my cup; Thou wilt maintain my lot! <sup>6</sup> My portion hath fallen to me in pleasant places; Yea, I have a goodly inheritance. <sup>7</sup> I will bless the LORD, who careth

for me; Yea, in the night my heart admonisheth me. <sup>8</sup> I set the LORD before me at all times; Since he is at my right hand, I shall not fall. <sup>9</sup> Therefore my heart is glad, and my spirit rejoiceth; Yea, my flesh dwelleth in security. <sup>10</sup> For thou wilt not give me up to the underworld; Nor wilt thou suffer thy holy one to see the pit. <sup>11</sup> Thou wilt show me the path of life; In thy presence is fulness of joy; At thy right hand are pleasures for evermore.

## 17

<sup>1</sup> "A psalm of David." Hear the righteous cause, O LORD! Attend to my cry; Give ear to my prayer from lips without deceit! <sup>2</sup> May my sentence come forth from thy presence; May thine eyes behold uprightness! <sup>3</sup> Provest thou my heart, visitest thou me in the night, Triest thou me like gold, thou shalt find nothing! <sup>4</sup> My thoughts do not vary from my lips. As to the deeds of men, Through the word of thy lips I have kept me from the paths of the destroyer. <sup>5</sup> Support my steps in thy paths, That my feet may not slip! <sup>6</sup> I call upon thee, O God! for thou wilt hear me; Incline thine ear to me, and listen to my prayer! <sup>7</sup> Show forth thy loving-kindness, O thou that savest by thy right hand Them that seek refuge in thee from their adversaries! <sup>8</sup> Guard me as the apple of the eye; Hide me under the shadow of thy wings <sup>9</sup> From the wicked who assault me, From my deadly enemies who compass me about! <sup>10</sup> They shut up their hard heart; With their mouth they speak haughtily. <sup>11</sup> They encompass us in all

our steps; They fix their eyes upon us, that they may cast us on the ground. <sup>12</sup> They are like a lion, eager for his prey; Like a young lion, lurking in secret places. <sup>13</sup> Arise, O LORD! disappoint them, cast them down! Deliver me from the wicked by thy sword, <sup>14</sup> From men, by thy hand, O LORD! from men of the world, Whose portion is in life; whom thou loadest with thy treasure; Whose children have enough, and leave their superfluity to their children. <sup>15</sup> But I through righteousness shall see thy face; I shall be satisfied with the revival of thy countenance.

## 18

<sup>1</sup> I love thee, O LORD, my strength! <sup>2</sup> Jehovah is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I trust; My shield, my strong defence, and my high tower. <sup>3</sup> I called upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised, And was delivered from my enemies. <sup>4</sup> The snares of death encompassed me; The floods of destruction filled me with dismay; <sup>5</sup> The snares of the underworld surrounded me, And the nets of death seized upon me. <sup>6</sup> In my distress I called upon the LORD, And cried unto my God; He heard my voice from his palace, And my cry came before him into his ears. <sup>7</sup> Then the earth quaked and trembled; The foundations of the mountains rocked and were shaken, Because his wrath was kindled. <sup>8</sup> A smoke went up from his nostrils, And fire from his mouth devoured; Burning coals shot forth from him. <sup>9</sup> He bowed the heavens, and came down; And darkness was

under his feet; <sup>10</sup> And he rode upon a cherub, and did fly; Yea, he did fly upon the wings of the wind. <sup>11</sup> And he made darkness his covering; His pavilion round about him was dark waters and thick clouds of the skies. <sup>12</sup> At the brightness before him, his thick clouds passed away; Then came hailstones and coals of fire. <sup>13</sup> The LORD also thundered from heaven, And the Most High uttered his voice, Amid hailstones and coals of fire. <sup>14</sup> He sent forth his arrows, and scattered them; Continual lightnings, and discomfited them. <sup>15</sup> Then the channels of the deep were seen, And the foundations of the earth were laid bare At thy rebuke, O LORD! At the blast of the breath of thy nostrils. <sup>16</sup> He stretched forth his hand from above; he took me, And drew me out of deep waters. <sup>17</sup> He delivered me from my strong enemy; From my adversaries, who were too powerful for me. <sup>18</sup> They fell upon me in the day of my calamity; But the LORD was my stay. <sup>19</sup> He brought me forth into a large place; He delivered me, because he delighted in me. <sup>20</sup> The LORD hath rewarded me according to my righteous; According to the cleanness of my hands hath he recompensed me. <sup>21</sup> For I have kept the ways of the LORD, And have not wickedly departed from my God. <sup>22</sup> For all his laws were in my sight; I did not put away his statutes from me. <sup>23</sup> I was upright before him, And kept myself from iniquity. <sup>24</sup> Therefore hath the LORD rewarded me according to my righteousness, According to the cleanness of my hands before his eyes. <sup>25</sup> To the merciful thou

showest thyself merciful; To the upright thou showest thyself upright; <sup>26</sup> To the pure thou showest thyself pure, And to the perverse thou showest thyself perverse. <sup>27</sup> For thou savest the afflicted people, But the haughty countenance thou bringest down. <sup>28</sup> Thou causeth my lamp to shine; Jehovah, my God, enlighteneth my darkness. <sup>29</sup> For through thee I have broken through troops; Through my God I have leaped over walls. <sup>30</sup> The ways of God are just and true; His word is pure, tried in the fire; He is a shield to all who put their trust in him. <sup>31</sup> Who, then, is God, save Jehovah? And who is a rock, save our God? <sup>32</sup> It is God that girded me with strength, And made my way plain. <sup>33</sup> He made my feet like the hind's, And set me in my high places; <sup>34</sup> He taught my hands to war, So that my arm bent the bow of brass. <sup>35</sup> Thou gavest me the shield of thy protection; Thy right hand held me up, And thy goodness made me great. <sup>36</sup> Thou didst make a wide path for my steps, So that my feet did not stumble. <sup>37</sup> I pursued my enemies and overtook them, And turned not back till I had destroyed them. <sup>38</sup> I smote them, so that they could not rise; They fell under my feet. <sup>39</sup> Thou didst gird me with strength for the battle; Thou didst cast down my adversaries under me. <sup>40</sup> Thou didst cause my enemies to turn their backs, So that I destroyed them that hated me. <sup>41</sup> They cried, but there was none to help; To Jehovah, but he answered them not. <sup>42</sup> I beat them small, like dust before the wind; I cast them out as the dirt



of the streets. <sup>43</sup> Thou hast delivered me from the assaults of the nations; Thou hast made me the head of the kingdoms. Who can stand before thee in thine anger? <sup>8</sup> Thou didst cause judgment to be heard from heaven; The earth trembled and was still, <sup>9</sup> When God arose to judgment, To save all the oppressed of the earth! <sup>10</sup> The wrath of man shall praise thee, When thou girdest on the whole of thy wrath! <sup>11</sup> Make and perform vows to Jehovah, your God! Let all that dwell around him bring gifts to the terrible One, <sup>12</sup> Who casteth down the pride of princes, Who is terrible to the kings of the earth!

A psalm of Asaph.” I call upon God; I cry aloud for help; I call upon God, that he would hear me! <sup>2</sup> In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord; In the night is my hand stretched forth continually; My soul refuseth to be comforted. <sup>3</sup> I remember God, and am

disquieted; I think of him, and my spirit is overwhelmed. <sup>4</sup> Thou keepest mine eyelids from closing; I am distressed, so that I cannot speak! <sup>5</sup> I think of the days of old,—The years of ancient times. <sup>6</sup> I call to remembrance my songs in the night; I meditate in my heart, And my spirit inquireth: <sup>7</sup> Will the Lord be angry for ever? Will he be favorable no more? <sup>8</sup> Is his mercy utterly withdrawn for ever? Doth his promise fail from generation to generation? <sup>9</sup> Hath God forgotten to be gracious? Hath he in anger shut up his compassion? <sup>10</sup> Then I say, “This is mine affliction, A change in the right hand of the Most High.” <sup>11</sup> I remember the deeds of Jehovah; I think of thy wonders of old. <sup>12</sup> I meditate on all thy works, And talk of thy doings. <sup>13</sup> Thy ways, O God! are holy! Who so great a god as our God? <sup>14</sup> Thou art a God who doest wonders; Thou hast manifested thy power among the nations. <sup>15</sup> With thy strong arm thou didst redeem thy people,—The sons of Jacob and Joseph. <sup>16</sup> The waters saw thee, O God! The waters saw thee, and feared, And the deep trembled. <sup>17</sup> The clouds poured out water, The skies sent forth thunder, And thine arrows flew. <sup>18</sup> Thy thunder roared in the whirlwind; Thy lightning illumined the world; The earth trembled and shook. <sup>19</sup> Thy way was through the sea, And thy path through great waters; And thy footsteps could not be found. <sup>20</sup> Thou didst lead thy people like a flock, By the hands of Moses and Aaron.

<sup>1</sup> “A psalm of Asaph.” Give ear, O my people, to my instruction! Incline your ears to the words of my mouth! <sup>2</sup> I will open my mouth in a psalm; I will utter sayings of ancient times. <sup>3</sup> What we have heard and learned, And our fathers have told us, <sup>4</sup> We will not hide from their children; Showing to the generation to come the praises of Jehovah, His might, and the wonders he hath wrought. <sup>5</sup> For he appointed statutes in Jacob, And established a law in Israel, Which he commanded our fathers To make known to their children; <sup>6</sup> So that the generation to come might know them; The children, which should be born, and rise up, Who should declare them to their children; <sup>7</sup> That they might put their trust in God, And not forget his deeds, But keep his commandments; <sup>8</sup> And might not be, like their forefathers, A stubborn and rebellious generation,—A generation whose heart was not fixed upon God, And whose spirit was not steadfast toward the Almighty. <sup>9</sup> The children of Ephraim were like armed bowmen, Who turn their backs in the day of battle. <sup>10</sup> They kept not the covenant of God, And refused to walk in his law; <sup>11</sup> And forgot his mighty deeds, And the wonders he had shown them. <sup>12</sup> Marvellous things did he in the sight of their fathers, In the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan. <sup>13</sup> He divided the sea, and caused them to pass through; Yea, he made the waters to stand as a heap. <sup>14</sup> By day he led them by a cloud, And all the night by a light of fire. <sup>15</sup> He clave the rocks in the wilderness, And gave them

drink, as from the great deep. <sup>16</sup> From the rock he brought flowing streams, And made water to run down like rivers. <sup>17</sup> Yet still they sinned against him, And provoked the Most High in the desert. <sup>18</sup> They tempted God in their hearts, By asking food for their delight. <sup>19</sup> Yea, they spake against God, and said, "Can God spread a table in the wilderness? <sup>20</sup> Behold! he smote the rock, and the water flowed, And streams gushed forth: Is he also able to give bread? Can he provide flesh for his people?" <sup>21</sup> When, therefore, the LORD heard this, he was wroth: So a fire was kindled against Jacob, And anger arose against Israel. <sup>22</sup> Because they believed not in God, And trusted not in his aid. <sup>23</sup> Yet he had commanded the clouds above, And had opened the doors of heaven; <sup>24</sup> And had rained down upon them manna for food, And had given them the corn of heaven. <sup>25</sup> Every one ate the food of princes; He sent them bread to the full. <sup>26</sup> Then he caused a strong wind to blow in the heavens, And by his power he brought a south wind; <sup>27</sup> He rained down flesh upon them as dust, And feathered fowls as the sand of the sea. <sup>28</sup> He caused them to fall in the midst of their camp, Round about their habitations. <sup>29</sup> So they did eat, and were filled; For he gave them their own desire. <sup>30</sup> Their desire was not yet satisfied, And their meat was yet in their mouths, <sup>31</sup> When the wrath of God came upon them, And slew their strong men, And smote down the chosen men of Israel. <sup>32</sup> For all this they sinned still, And put no trust in his wondrous works. <sup>33</sup> Therefore

he consumed their days in vanity, And their years in sudden destruction. <sup>34</sup> When he slew them, they sought him; They returned, and sought earnestly for God; <sup>35</sup> And remembered that God was their rock, And the Most High their redeemer. <sup>36</sup> But they only flattered him with their mouths, And spake falsely to him with their tongues. <sup>37</sup> For their hearts were not true to him, Nor were they steadfast in his covenant. <sup>38</sup> Yet, being full of compassion, he forgave their iniquity, And would not utterly destroy them; Often he restrained his indignation, And stirred not up all his anger. <sup>39</sup> He remembered that they were but flesh,—A breath, that passeth and cometh not back. <sup>40</sup> How often did they provoke him in the wilderness! How often did they anger him in the desert! <sup>41</sup> Again and again they tempted God, And offended the Holy One of Israel. <sup>42</sup> They remembered not his hand, Nor the day when he delivered them from the enemy; <sup>43</sup> What signs he had wrought in Egypt, And what wonders in the fields of Zoan. <sup>44</sup> He turned their rivers into blood, So that they could not drink of their streams. <sup>45</sup> He sent amongst them flies, which devoured them, And frogs, which destroyed them. <sup>46</sup> He gave also their fruits to the caterpillar, And their labor to the locust. <sup>47</sup> He destroyed their vines with hail, And their sycamore-trees with frost. <sup>48</sup> He also gave up their cattle to hail, And their flocks to hot thunderbolts. <sup>49</sup> He sent against them the fierceness of his anger, Wrath, indignation, and

woe,—A host of angels of evil. <sup>50</sup> He made a way for his anger, He spared them not from death, But gave up their lives to the pestilence. <sup>51</sup> He smote all the firstborn in Egypt; The first-fruits of their strength in the tents of Ham. <sup>52</sup> But he led forth his own people like sheep, And guided them like a flock in the wilderness. <sup>53</sup> He led them on safely, so that they feared not, While the sea overwhelmed their enemies. <sup>54</sup> He brought them to his own sacred border, Even to this mountain which his right hand had gained. <sup>55</sup> He cast out the nations before them, And divided their land by a measuring-line, as an inheritance, And caused the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents. <sup>56</sup> Yet they tempted and provoked God, the Most High, And kept not his statutes; <sup>57</sup> Like their fathers they were faithless, and turned back; They turned aside, like a deceitful bow. <sup>58</sup> They provoked his anger by their high places, And stirred up his jealousy by their graven images. <sup>59</sup> God saw this, and was wroth, And greatly abhorred Israel; <sup>60</sup> So that he forsook the habitation at Shiloh, The tabernacle where he dwelt among men, <sup>61</sup> And delivered his strength into captivity, And his glory into the hand of the enemy. <sup>62</sup> His own people he gave up to the sword, And was wroth with his own inheritance. <sup>63</sup> Fire consumed their young men, And their maidens did not bewail them. <sup>64</sup> Their priests fell by the sword, And their widows made no lamentation. <sup>65</sup> But at length the Lord awaked as from sleep, As a hero who had been overpowered by wine; <sup>66</sup> He smote

his enemies, and drove them back, And covered them with everlasting disgrace. <sup>67</sup> Yet he rejected the tents of Joseph, And chose not the tribe of Ephraim; <sup>68</sup> But chose the tribe of Judah, The Mount Zion which he loved; <sup>69</sup> Where he built, like the heavens, his sanctuary; Like the earth, which he hath established for ever. <sup>70</sup> And he chose David, his servant, And took him from the sheepfolds; <sup>71</sup> From tending the suckling ewes he brought him To feed Jacob his people, And Israel his inheritance. <sup>72</sup> He fed them with an upright heart, And guided them with skilful hands.

the wild asses quench their thirst. <sup>12</sup> About them the birds of heaven have their habitation; They sing among the branches. <sup>13</sup> He watereth the hills from his chambers; The earth is satisfied with the fruit of thy works! <sup>14</sup> He causeth grass to spring up for cattle, And herbage for the service of man, To bring forth food out of the earth, <sup>15</sup> And wine that gladdeneth the heart of man, Making his face to shine more than oil, And bread that strengtheneth man's heart. <sup>16</sup> The trees of the LORD are full of sap, The cedars of Lebanon, which he hath planted; <sup>17</sup> There the birds build their nests; In the cypresses the stork hath her abode. <sup>18</sup> The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats, And the rocks for the conies. <sup>19</sup> He appointed the moon to mark seasons; The sun knoweth when to go down. <sup>20</sup> Thou makest darkness, and it is night, When all the beasts of the forest go forth! <sup>21</sup> The young lions roar for prey, And seek their food from God. <sup>22</sup> When the sun ariseth, they withdraw themselves, And lie down in their dens. <sup>23</sup> Man goeth forth to his work, And to his labor, until the evening. <sup>24</sup> O LORD! how manifold are thy works! In wisdom hast thou made them all! The earth is full of thy riches! <sup>25</sup> Lo! this great and wide sea! In it are moving creatures without number, Animals small and great. <sup>26</sup> There go the ships; There is the leviathan, which thou hast made to play therein. <sup>27</sup> All these wait on thee To give them their food in due season. <sup>28</sup> Thou givest it to them, they gather it; Thou openest thine hand, they are satisfied with good. <sup>29</sup> Thou hidest

thy face, they are confounded; Thou takest away their breath, they die, And return to the dust. <sup>30</sup> Thou sendest forth thy spirit, they are created, And thou renewest the face of the earth. <sup>31</sup> The glory of the LORD shall endure for ever; The LORD shall rejoice in his works; <sup>32</sup> He looketh on the earth, and it trembleth; He toucheth the hills, and they smoke. <sup>33</sup> I will sing to the LORD as long as I live, I will sing praise to my God while I have my being. <sup>34</sup> May my meditation be acceptable to him! I will rejoice in the LORD. <sup>35</sup> May sinners perish from the earth, And the wicked be no more! Bless the LORD, O my soul! Praise ye the LORD!
