<sup>1</sup> IN the second year of Darius the king, in the sixth month, on the first *day* of the month, the word of the Lord came by the hand of the prophet Haggai, saying, Speak to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, of the tribe of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, saying,

<sup>2</sup> Thus saith the Lord Almighty, saying, This people say, The time is not come to build the house of the Lord.

<sup>3</sup> And the word of the Lord came by the hand of the prophet Haggai, saying,

<sup>4</sup> Is it time for you to dwell in your ceiled houses, whereas our house is desolate?

<sup>5</sup> And now thus saith the Lord Almighty; Consider your ways, I pray you.

<sup>6</sup> Ye have sown much, but brought in little; ye have eaten, and are not satisfied; ye have drunk, and are not satisfied with drink, ye have clothed yourselves, and have not become warm thereby: and he that earns wages has gathered *them* into a bag full of holes.

<sup>7</sup> Thus saith the Lord Almighty; Consider your ways.

<sup>8</sup> Go up to the mountain, and cut timber; build the house, and I will take pleasure in it, and be glorified, saith the Lord.

<sup>9</sup> Ye looked for much, and there came little; and it was brought into the house, and I blew it away.

Therefore thus saith the Lord Almighty, Because my house is desolate, and ye run every one into his own house:

<sup>10</sup> therefore shall the sky withhold dew, and the earth shall keep back her produce.

<sup>11</sup> And I will bring a sword upon the land, and upon the mountains, and upon the corn, and upon the wine, and upon the oil, and all that the earth produces, and upon the men, and upon the cattle, and upon all the labors of their hands.

<sup>12</sup> And Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, of the tribe of Judah, and Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and all the remnant of the people, hearkened to the voice of the Lord their God. and the words of the prophet Haggai, according as the Lord their God had sent him to them, and the people feared before the Lord.

<sup>13</sup> And Haggai the Lord's messenger spoke among the messengers of the Lord to the people, saying, I am with you, saith the Lord.

<sup>14</sup> And the Lord stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, of the tribe of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and the spirit of the remnant of all the people; and they went in, and wrought in the house of the Lord Almighty their God,

<sup>15</sup> on the four and twentieth *day* of the sixth month, in the second year of Darius the king.

<sup>2</sup> Speak now to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, of the tribe of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and to all the remnant of the people, saying,

<sup>3</sup> Who *is there* of you that saw this house in her former glory? and how do ye now look upon it, as it were nothing before your eyes?

<sup>4</sup> Yet now be strong, O Zerubbabel, saith the Lord; and strengthen thyself, O Joshua the high priest, the son of Jehozadak; and let all the people of the land strengthen themselves, saith the Lord, and work, for I am with you, saith the Lord Almighty;

<sup>5</sup> and my Spirit remains in the midst of you; be of good courage.

<sup>6</sup> For thus saith the Lord Almighty; Yet once I will shake the heaven, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry *land*;

<sup>7</sup> and I will shake all nations, and the choice *portions* of all the nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the Lord Almighty.

<sup>8</sup> Mine is the silver, and mine the gold, saith the Lord Almighty.

<sup>9</sup> For the glory of this house shall be great, the latter more than the former, saith the Lord Almighty: and in this place will I give peace, saith the Lord Almighty, even peace of soul for a possession to everyone that builds, to raise up this temple.

<sup>10</sup> On the four and twentieth *day* of the ninth month, in the second year of Darius, the word of the Lord came to Haggai the prophet, saying,

Haggai 2:11

<sup>11</sup> Thus saith the Lord Almighty; Inquire now of the priests *concerning* the law, saying,

<sup>12</sup> If a man should take holy flesh in the skirt of his garment, and the skirt of his garment should touch bread, or pottage, or wine, or oil, or any meat, shall it be holy? And the priests answered and said, No.

<sup>13</sup> And Haggai said, If a defiled person who is unclean by reason of a dead body, touch any of these, shall it be defiled? And the priests answered and said, It shall be defiled.

<sup>14</sup> And Haggai answered and said, So is this people, and so is this nation before me, saith the Lord; and so are all the works of their hands: and whosoever shall approach them, shall be defiled because of their early burdens: they shall be pained because of their toils; and ye have hated him that reproved in the gates.

<sup>15</sup> And now consider, I pray you, from this day and beforetime, before they laid a stone on a stone in the temple of the Lord, what manner of men ye were.

<sup>16</sup> When ye cast into the corn bin twenty measures of barley, and there were *only* ten measures of barley: and ye went to the vat to draw out fifty measures, and there were *but* twenty.

<sup>17</sup> I smote you with barrenness, and with blasting, and all the works of your hands with hail; yet ye returned not to me, saith the Lord.

<sup>18</sup> Set your hearts now *to think* from this day and upward, from the four and twentieth *day* of the ninth month, even from the day when the Haggai 2:19

foundation of the temple of the Lord was laid;

<sup>19</sup> consider in your hearts, whether *this* shall be known on the corn floor, and whether yet the vine, and the fig tree, and the pomegranate, and the olive trees that bear no fruit *are with you*: from this day will I bless *you*.

<sup>20</sup> And the word of the Lord came the second time to Haggai the prophet, on the four and twentieth *day* of the month, saying,

<sup>21</sup> Speak to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, of the tribe of Judah, saying,

I shake the heaven, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry *land*;

<sup>22</sup> and I will overthrow the thrones of kings, and I will destroy the power of the kings of the nations; and I will overthrow chariots and riders; and the horses and their riders shall come down, every one by the sword striving against his brother.

<sup>23</sup> In that day, saith the Lord Almighty, I will take thee, O Zerubbabel, the son of Shealtiel, my servant, saith the Lord, and will make thee as a seal: for I have chosen thee, saith the Lord Almighty.
